

### From Bishop Daniel G. Beaudoin

Dear Friends in Christ,

"I did not shrink from doing anything helpful, proclaiming the message to you and teaching you publicly and from house to house, as I testified to both Jews and Greeks about repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus." (Acts 20:20-21).

Two weeks ago, I was on a zoom meeting with the Conference of Bishops. Pastor Albert Starr was a guest presenter. Pastor Starr serves as the Director for Ethnic Specific, Multicultural Ministries, and Racial Justice. The words that he shared with us were grounded in prayer and Scripture. As he reflected on the murder of George Floyd and the subsequent nationwide protests, he spoke a phrase that I cannot let go of. He said that the way forward will be marked by a "metanoia movement". Metanoia is the Greek word for repentance, so Pastor Starr was calling us to a "movement of repentance" that brings sweeping change to our personal and collective hearts and minds. How very true and how very Biblical.

In the Book of Acts 20:20-21, Paul reminds the Ephesian elders about the message of the Crucified and Risen Jesus that he proclaimed and taught from house to house. This message was marked by a call to repentance and a call to faith. Reading these words from the Book of Acts reminded me of the opening words of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. "Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news" (Mark 1:14-15). The message of the good news of Jesus is also grounded in a call to repentance and a call to faith (believe). It appears to me that Jesus, St. Paul, and Pastor Starr are all speaking the same language.

Later this week, I plan to call Pastor Albert Starr to learn more about his call for us to begin a "metanoia movement", a movement of repentance to change our personal and collective hearts and minds.

As you pray and ponder these next few days, how might you and your parish take a first step into a "metanoia movement" toward racial reconciliation and justice?



Are we patient and kind? Are we concerned about the safety of others? Have we been upset or angry because the churches have been closed? In all of this, how have we been living out our faith in a loving, forgiving and caring way? Through Jesus, God has shown us how much He loves us. Through these troubling times, how have we reflected that love?

Dear Trinity Member,

This letter is to inform you of the upcoming return to In-person worship services at Trinity.

When trinity does return to gathering for parish activities, we seek to do it in ways that are inclusive and safe for the most vulnerable among us. We gather because we love God, but we limit ourselves because we love our neighbor. It is important to stress that in this time, not gathering for worship does not make you a "bad Christian" or mean that you do not love God. In fact, it is entirely possible that the most loving thing you can do right now for yourself and your fellow Christians is not gathering for worship.

**PLEASE STAY AT HOME** if you are symptomatic or have a temperature or have been exposed to someone who has shown symptoms. Please consider staying at home if you are a "high risk" individual. And please remember that you will still be able to view our taped worship services on Facebook each week during this time also.

For the sake of the health and safety of our members, Trinity will strive to follow the guidelines from the Northwestern Ohio Synod office, the State of Ohio Department of Health, and the Center for Disease Control.

Worship: We will resume gathering for worship on Sunday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, at 9:00 am only and Sunday thereafter until further notice. To maintain physical distance, we have limited seating. You must call Carol, the church secretary, at 419-626-0204 by Thursday at noon to reserve a spot for that weeks' Sunday worship service.

Wearing a mask during an epidemic is a courtesy to those around you. **Please bring your own mask** and we ask that it remain on for the duration of the worship service and if you are in the building.

The church will have hand sanitizer available but bringing your own and using it often is a good idea. Hymnals, cards, pencils, and cushions have been removed. Please bring your own cushion if you need to use one.

Only the south and elevator doors will be open for use at this time. Doors to the church will be opened 15 minutes before the worship service begins. An usher will direct you to a seat. Families and couples will be seated together.

For the sake of physical distancing, cleaning, and sanitizing; we will strive to use as little of the building as possible. Hallways, rooms, and areas of the church such as the Fellowship Hall and church office may be closed off. Please only use the designated areas, entrances, and exits.

No food or drink will be allowed in the Sanctuary as has been done previously.

There will be no Sunday school, no sharing of the peace, and no coffee room. Please do all socializing outside the church building only.

Communion will be offered every Sunday by the continuous distribution process.


There will be no passing of the offering plate. There will be an offering plate at the front Sanctuary entrance only and you can drop off your offering when you enter or leave the worship service.

There will be singing! We will sing an opening and closing hymn and a mask must be worn when doing so.

We hope you find these guidelines helpful when making your decision to return to In-person worship and we pray you will all be cooperative with following them for the sake of each other's safety. And ask that you be kind and considerate of one another; put aside politics or the need to be right for this one hour. Prayers for Trinity and its members is always encouraged!

## TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - June 18, 2020 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Barb Wobser, Dave Miller, Sally Warner, Jim Bertsch, Bonnie Lieb, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Mike Markley, Pastor Cathy, and secretary, Carol Dahs.

Not in Attendance: Judy Driscoll

Meeting called to order by President, Dave Miller.

Opening devotions were given by Jim Bertsch.

Minutes of previous meeting (May 21) were reviewed. Sally made a motion to accept the meeting minutes with the correction that it was not a Zoom meeting. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bonnie. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for May was reviewed. Jim stated that the quarterly insurance was paid along with the organ maintenance which is part of the deficit in May. Candy made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sally. Motion passed. Carol will look into what can be done to do online giving.

President's Report: Candy gave an overview of her committee findings on how Trinity should proceed during the COVID-19 situation. After discussion Jim made a motion to start worship services back up on July 5 at 9:00 am only. Following guidelines given by Candy's committee, with communion each week, until the next council meeting on July 16 and then re-evaluate. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mike. Motion passed with 6 for and one against. Sally and Candy will put together the letter to members announcing the re-opening of Trinity. A letter will be sent separate along with it being put in the July Newsletter. Carol will get with individuals signed up for flowers to see if they still want to do them. She will also contact Castalia Flower Shop about them bringing flowers again each Sunday. Sally will get with the Altar Committee and Acolytes. Denny Sessler will contact the ushers. Dave Miller will contact the lectors. Sally will have Barry change the sign board. Mike will talk to Barry about the use of the projection screen and other tech stuff in the sanctuary. Dave will get the hand sanitizer dispensers and the hand sanitizer. Sally will donate 30 masks for anyone who forgets theirs. We also have child size ones that Nancy Vollmer donated. There will be an opening and closing hymn only with only one verse being sung with masks on. Carol will look for signs that can be printed off and hung at the doors to remind people of the new policies. There will still be a Facebook video done, details will be worked on. Dave is still working on getting a schedule setup with Sherry Krieger for the Transition Team to continue. The \$1841 overage from the tuck-pointing work will be paid from the Building Improvement fund. There was discussion on a letter that Trinity received from St. Paul Lutheran Church. Council agreed that it was not something Trinity wanted to take on at this time. Dave will write a response letter.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph said that he read through our Constitution and By-Laws and the only thing that he felt should be updated was the amount that Council can approve without having to go to the Congregation for approval. This change will be added to the October Congregational meeting for review.

Property – Mike Markley – Mike gave the down payment to Kreimes for resealing the church parking lot. They have been in and sealed the cracks already. Mike had another fire safe filing cabinet delivered. There is now a locking doorknob on the records retention room. The tuck pointing is done. Carol's new desk is ordered. Mike has new better-quality furnace filters on order to put in before we open. Sally's office in process of renovation. Mike is looking at having Kreimes put a new step at the back door of the church. Cost should be under \$1000. Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch – Adele asked to not be paid for June since she was paid for April and May and was not available at that time. Council stated that she should still be paid as she has done other work throughout the year that she was not paid for.

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – Sally stated that the video services are going well.

New Business – Sally made a motion to pay the Church Windows yearly support/software update fee of \$419. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jim. Motion passed. Carol asked what could be cleaned out of the sacristy. Old communion ware will be donated with the bibles if the donation place will take them. Scott Sessler's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his ordination will be July 2. Trinity has a gift in the works, and it will be put in the newsletter for anyone wishing to send him a congratulations card. Marie Nielsen will have to follow the social distancing guidelines for her wedding on August 1. This will limit her seating to 50 people max. Carol will let her know
