### OUTDOOR WORSHIP SERVICE WITH COMMUNION

Please join us on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am for an Outdoor Worship Service here at Trinity. As in the past, the second Sunday of September has been set aside for the celebrating of *GOD'S WORK – OUR HANDS* day. And here at Trinity we would like to keep this tradition going. Things will be a little different as we can't gather around each other to do projects but we will be doing something a little different this year. You will have to come and join us and see how our Hands will be doing God's Work!

We ask that you bring your own lawn chairs to sit on. You will be asked to wear a mask, sit with your family but 6 feet apart from others, and for those who would prefer to stay in your car, we will have special places for you to park. There is no need to call in to let us know you are coming. Simply show up anywhere between 8:30 and 9:00am. (No sooner please as we will be setting up.)

A regular worship service will take place with continuous flow for Communion happening also. We have done this before while we were still able to meet and it has gone extremely well so we are going to offer it at this outdoor service too.

Now, if there should be rain that Sunday, we will postpone this service and have it the following Sunday, September 20<sup>th</sup>. We will have to watch the weather, maybe bring an umbrella if there is a slight chance for rain, and see what happens.



GOD'S WORK – OUR HANDS! COME WORSHIP – OUT IN GOD'S CREATION!



On Wednesday, August 19<sup>th</sup> we held our annual "Blessing of the Book bags" outside with 51 people attending. This year, due to Covid 19, our ceremony had a little twist to it. Pastor Cathy had received from a colleague of hers a new and more personal prayer service for this event. So, we put things together and came up with our Blessing ceremony. I am including the prayers that were offered at this event and we hope that you will read them and at the end of each prayer, please add in those people either aloud or in silent that you would like to add to your prayers.

Heavenly God, we come to you this school year with confusion, heavy hearts, frustration, and sadness. It isn't what any of us expected nor wanted. But we know that in You, we have hope. And we know that You can turn our sorrows into joy. So, with that in mind, we bring to you our concerns, needs, and petitions, knowing that you will hear us and respond...

We lift up to you, God, all the children who will be going to school online or who will be home schooled. We pray that they feel loved and connected. We pray for motivation, so that they are able to learn the material presented to them and we ask for your blessings upon them while they struggle with limited social interaction opportunities...Hear our prayer for...

Lord, we pray for all the children who will be learning in person. We pray you watch over them and we ask that you help them be responsible, good listeners and good learners. We know we are asking things of our children that we have never asked before, help them be flexible and to adapt. Hear our prayer for...

We also pray for those children who will be learning in yet a different way – online and in person. This new way of learning we know will be confusing and difficult at first. Help these children have patience and help them have compassion for themselves, their classmates and their teachers. Hear our prayer for...

Counselor God, we want to name our children and youth who have specific needs – physically, mentally, socially or emotionally. This pandemic has been especially hard for some of them and their families. Every child is different but you know their needs and what is best for them. Help these families make the right decisions for their child and help these children overcome the hurdles that have been placed in front of them. God, with your help these children and families can excel. Hear our prayer for...

God, please be with the parents at the time as they struggle to not only be parents, but also teachers and counselors. We see them juggling multiple responsibilities – including their children, their marriages and their jobs. We see them deliberating and weighing all the options for their children and families. They are having to make decisions they never thought they would have to make. God, please give them guidance in their decision making and peace of mind. Hear our prayer for...

God, we also want to lift up our college students. These young adults that are ready to leave the nest, to be on their own and to be independent. This isn't what they wanted, what they were expecting or what they need. please guide them through this transition - whether it be online, at home, on campus, or something in between. Give them strength, give them an open mind so they can

learn and give them peace in whatever situation they find themselves in. Help the obstacles strengthen them and not overwhelm them. Hear our prayer for ...

Lastly God, we want to pray for our teachers and administrators. Our teachers who are overwhelmed and our administrators that are struggling with though decisions. ### Question for Reviewing the History of the Congregation Histogram

A histogram is a series of questions that help to review the ministry of the congregation. Current patters of interaction as a congregation are often influenced by our past patterns of interactions. We started at the beginning of the formation of Trinity Lutheran Church and moved to the present in increments that represented each pastor's tenure, major events, additions, losses, changes in surrounding, and major stressors for the church. Certainly, there are historical recordings but what is probably more important are the stories that have been handed down and how they have been interpreted over the years of the congregation's existence.

### TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - August 20, 2020 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Barb Wobser, Dave Miller, Sally Warner, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Mike Markley, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs.

Not in Attendance: Judy Driscoll

Meeting called to order by President, Dave Miller.

Opening devotions were given by Mike Markley.

Minutes of previous meeting (July 16) were reviewed. Sally made a motion to accept the meeting minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Barb. Motion passed. Barb made a motion to accept the meeting minutes from council's special meeting on July 29, 2020. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for July was reviewed. Jim stated that the Pavement Fund was almost depleted in the payment of the resealing project. Mike made a motion to move \$2000 from the Reserve Fund into the Pavement Fund to keep the balance up and avoid low balance fees. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Candy. Motion passed. Steve Patterson recommended some fund changes with this being an election year. Jim and his team will get with Steve on these changes. Last month Jim stated that Trinity's income was down with the COVID crisis. However, he also wanted to let us know that our expenses were also down due to Trinity's not having a full-time pastor. Sally made a motion to except the treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Barb. Motion passed.

President's Report: Trinity will remain closed as Erie County continues in the red zone. Barb gave an overview of the Transition Teams last two meetings. Council chairs that will be open at the end of 2020 are: President and Congregational Life. Dave is ineligible for a council seat in 2021. Candy agreed to stay on as Congregational Life chair if there are no other nominations at the next Congregational Meeting. Jim made a motion that the By-Laws be updated to state the council can approve up to \$5000 in spending without having the Congregations approval. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bonnie. Motion passed. This will be brought before the Congregational meeting in October.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph stated that the Blessing of the Bookbags on August 19 had gone very well.

Property – Mike Markley – Mike received a proposal for a new set of Educational Center Entry Doors (West) from Janotta and Herner. This will be discussed at the Congregational meeting to see if it is something they would like to pursue. Mike will put some new rubber seals on the bottom of the current set of doors to help with the leaking. Plaster work by the new altar steps will be completed soon, along with some touch up painting. Mike reported that the following projects are now complete: Outdoor window painting, including the back railing and door into the furnace room; lower lever water fountain cleaned out; South end cross now lights up; removed old mercury light that was not functioning; changed out light bulbs in outdoor sign and put new seal around to keep out water and bugs; new west end doors sanctuary doors have been ordered. Ron Van Zandt put in a bid of \$575 to put in a new concrete back step. This will be done sometime next week. The hand railing on the parsonage will be worked on and there are some shingles that need to be looked at on the church before damage can start.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch –

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – They are looking at possibly doing an outdoor service in September for God's Work Our Hands Sunday.

Old Business – Carol will get with Jim and look into presenting information on Tithe.ly at the Congregational Meeting.

Dear Friends in Christ.

# "And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love" (1 Corinthians 13:13)

As I prepare to lead the Synod in 2021: The Year of Generosity, I am doing a "deep reading" and study of 1st and 2nd Corinthians. Last week, I worked through St. Paul's well known "love passage" in 1 Corinthians 13. Bible scholars call it an "epideictic showpiece", an example of "rhetoric in its highest form", and a "jarring and deliberative argument". I find Paul's words simply beautiful and deeply inspiring. Please take a moment to slowly and carefully read through St. Paul's poem, the Way of Love.

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

As you allow St. Paul's last phrase to sing to your soul, I ask two simple questions. As you think back over the last 24 hours,

- 1. When were you loved?
- 2. When did you love?


The Stewardship and Finance Team will make a recommendation to the Congregation Council, and, in turn, the Council will place its recommendation before the congregation at its annual meeting in October.
