Then the tradition of wearing frightening garb came into being. There are two different accounts as to the reason. The other idea is that the costumes were a reminder that those evil (unbelieving) souls were out there, trying to get to you, and you should thus be cautious.

And so it has evolved into what has now become an event where we party, dress in costumes and for the kids, go out and seek candy and treats.

But in all of this, we must remember that it is a time in which we are to remember our loved ones who have died, either in this last year or times gone by, giving thanks for their love and for passing the faith down to us.

This year we are going to let the kids dress up for Trunks for Treats, (if they chose) but all kids and adults must wear a mouth and nose covering or mask.


All children must bring their own bag, bucket or container to put their treats in.

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - September 17, 2020 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Barb Wobser, Judy Driscoll, Sally Warner, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Mike Markley, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Dave Miller

Meeting called to order by Vice-President, Sally Warner.

Opening devotions were given by Bonnie Lieb.

Minutes of previous meeting (August 20) were reviewed. Barb made a motion to accept the meeting minutes with the correction under New Business of Congregation Council Meeting to October 25 not October 15. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for August was reviewed. Jim stated that the Current Fund balance was incorrect because the money that Fred Wobser gave for the new doors was placed in Current and it should have been placed in Building Improvements, so the balance is approximately \$4000 in Current. Barb made a motion to accept the treasurer's report with the noted correction. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

President's Report: Trinity will continue with the 9:00 am outdoor services if weather permits and the COVID zone stays at orange or yellow. If there is inclement weather, then the single service will be held inside. Communion will be taken back to the normal 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month. The Transition Team has one more meeting in October. The Call Committee will take over at the first of the year. There is a Profile Paper to write yet.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph stated that that the outdoor service on September 13 was well received. Pastor Cathy and Pastor Ralph will be going back to just one of them being here for Sunday services.

Congregational Care Ministry Team Report: Barry sent a letter stating his request to be removed as the chair of the team. Currently there isn't much the team can do with the COVID restrictions. Those in the hospital will only be known to the secretary unless there is a request from the individual hospitalized to involve a Pastor. HIPPA rules are being followed more closely.

Faith Builders – Barb Wobser – Barb requested Trinity look into purchasing Zoom so that she can get the Confirmation Class back on track for this year. Carol will look at what is costs and email council so they can decide what to do. Barb needs to get this going soon.

Mission Service – Judy Driscoll – Judy's group is working on who the Mission Endowment Fund's should be donated to in 2021. Bonnie is looking into the logistics of doing the Pork and Sauerkraut Dinner this year.

Property – Mike Markley – The Facility Use form for Ben Breay & Maryl Bango was approved for their April 10, 2021 wedding. Mike has the weather stripping for the Educational Wing outside doors. Mike will get an update on the progress of getting the new front doors that Fred has purchased. Concrete at the back door has been poured and looks great. Judy made a motion to accept the bid Mike got for two hand railings for the new step for \$835, uninstalled. 2nd by Barb. Motion passed. Mike received a proposal for snow removal from Dunlap's for 2020-2021 season.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch – The committee met with Steven Patterson this week. They moved some funds around to help maximize Trinity's earning abilities through the election season. Jim will work up the figures for 2% and 3% raises for employees for 2021. Council will make their recommendations from those figures for the 2021 budget.

Old Business –Candy made a motion to accept the Audit Report from March 13, 2020. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

New Business – There was discussion on trying to follow the By-laws set forth by Trinity on this years council election process. A nomination committee of Bonnie, Jim, and Mike will get together and make their recommendations for nominees to open council positions. Carol will help them get the letters out to those prospective people. Carol will type of the proposed changes to the Property Team's ability to spend up to \$5000 with council's approval and email this to council to be sure they are all on the same page.

Dear Friends in Christ,

"And again, Jesus said, "To what should I compare the kingdom of God? It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened" (Luke 13:20-21).

It doesn't always have to be big with flashing lights, surround sound, and blazing technology. It can start small. In fact, that's how God's economy often works, by taking what is small and growing it into something great.

Think about that little town of Bethlehem. Ruth, a foreigner, decides to accompany Naomi back to Bethlehem. Two women of faith, who struggle and suffer, only to be blessed by God. A few years later, while in Bethlehem, Samuel anoints Jesse's youngest son, David, as the King of Israel, only after he makes his way (unsuccessfully) through all the older brothers first. And in the fullness of time, God comes to Bethlehem, incarnate, as an infant, born to a poor and humble mother. God has a way of taking what is small and growing it into something great.

So, what little things may God be calling you to do today? On my list of to-dos for today, there are a few small things.

- 1. Read 1 Timothy chapter 5, and pray the Daily Texts
- 2. Write 4 handwritten thank you notes
- 3. Call and pray with someone who is sick
- 4. Finish this short e-mail blast devotion

Just a few small things to do, but when we do those small things again and again over time, those small habits and actions can grow into something great. Think about it.

What happens when you read and reflect on Scripture and pray every day? You will become a person who is grounded in Prayer and God's Word.

What would happen if you wrote 4 handwritten thank you notes every day? You will build a culture of generosity in your church and community?

What might occur if you called and prayed with someone every day? You will bring hope and the promise of God's presence.

What happens when you finish your e-mail blast on time? You will bring a smile to Caroline Guy, our Coordinator of Communications and Technology. And you want to make her smile, because Caroline is amazing, and we are grateful to serve with her.

It doesn't always have to be big with flashing lights, surround sound, and blazing technology. It can start small, or as Jesus reminds us, it can be as simple as a little bit of yeast, working its way through three measures of flour until everything is leavened.

So, may you go. Go and do the little things. Go and practice the small things. God and be God's yeast. Knowing and trusting that God will take what is small and grow it into something great.
