A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

The first thoughts that come to mind as I write this for the November newsletter is how different Thanksgiving and the holidays will be this year. And I imagine that at many tables, laden with the traditional fare of turkey, potatoes, and vegetables of various sorts as well as desserts, we will still try to have some sort of normality for the day of Thanksgiving. I know that at our table the inevitable question of: *what are we thankful for*, will be

asked just because it's Thanksgiving. It will be hard to feel blessed when not everyone, that is normally sitting around the table, will be present.

Yes, it's hard to think of being thankful when our life seems to have been interrupted. And it's hard to think of blessings. So what do you do with those hard and difficult times when being thankful is the farthest thing on your mind. Do we simply write them off as times with a sense that God has forsaken us?

During this time, I can't help but think of the prophets from the Old Testament as they would lament about feeling that God had left them alone. In Psalm 22 we read: *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?* We also find Job declaring that he cannot *behold him* – meaning God (Job 23:8-9). But if we stopped with just the laments of the saints who have gone before us, we would never hear of the strong presence of God in our lives, no matter what the circumstance. *Fear not, for I am with you*, declares God to Job and even the Psalmist in Chapter 23 states: *I will fear no evil for you are with me*. The prophet's laments turn to thankfulness, as they realize God has never left their side.

Thanksgiving is not only a time to count our blessings of having loved ones around, or the accomplishments we've been blessed with in our lives over the past year. It is also a time to remember that no matter what type of circumstance befalls us, God continues to walk with us and fulfills God's promises. So, as we gather at our tables on Thanksgiving Day - which will be far from normal, let us start with giving thanks to God for God is Immanuel – God is with us.

This year, as with all traditions, we will be doing our Thanksgiving Eve service a little different. Trinity has recently subscribed to Zoom and we now have an account. Instead of doing a pre-recorded Facebook devotion, we are going to experiment by using Zoom on Thanksgiving Eve. This will allow us to have some interaction with one another. And, it allows me to give you some homework! So, before our devotion time on Wednesday, November 25 at 7:00 pm. I want you to think about a couple of questions which I've listed below and then we will take time to share them and then I'll write them on our *Thankful Pumpkin*.

- 1) Where have you seen God in your life?
- 2) I am grateful you (mom, dad, sister/brother, grandma/grandpa, etc) are in my life because.....
- 3) Other things you are grateful for on this day?

Please know, I count each of you as a blessing in my life and give thanks to God for your ministry.

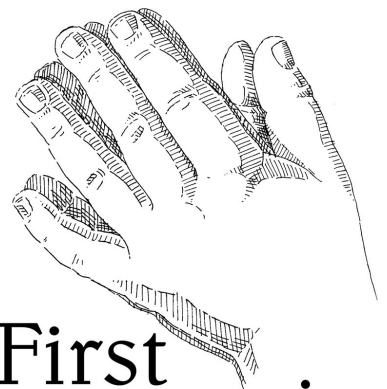
Serve the Lord with Gladness

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - October 15, 2020 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Dave Miller, Barb Wobser, Sally Warner, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Cathy, Mike Markley, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Judy Driscoll

Meeting called to order by President, Dave Miller.

Opening devotions were given by Jim Bertsch.

Minutes of previous meeting (September) were reviewed. Sally made a motion to accept the meeting minutes with the correction under Mission Service to change the Mission Endowment Fund to Community Mission Fund. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for September was reviewed. Jim stated that the quarterly reports from Thrivent show that most everything is back up. Barb made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

President's Report: A letter from Jean Cline was received and discussed. Considering the circumstances, attendance has been good. Sunday School will be starting back up at 10:00 am on Sundays. The Transition Team had their last meeting. As soon as the new council is set in 2021 the Call Committee will be setup. Sally made a motion to accept the agenda for the Congregational Council meeting on October 25. 2nd by Mike. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph has been exposed to COVID and he and Pat are now on a two-week quarantine. Pastor Cathy is looking into doing a Zoom type devotion for Thanksgiving Eve. First Communion and All Saints Sunday will take place on November 1.

Congregational Care Ministry Team Report: Dave will get with Barry on who could take over this team in 2021.

Faith Builders – Barb Wobser – Barb is looking into doing Confirmation on Sunday evenings at 7:00 pm via Zoom.

Mission Service – Judy Driscoll – Community Mission Fund Recommendations were discussed. Jim made some suggested changes to what was proposed. The pork and sauerkraut dinner will happen on November 1. It will be carry out only and it will be cancelled if the county goes back into the red zone.

Property – Mike Markley – Mike has the new weather stripping installed on the west educational wing glass paneled doors. The new front sanctuary doors are being installed. Janotta and Herner have about 80% of the south set of doors done. Mike shared his 2021 wish list. Council asked that instead of trimming trees that Mike get an estimate for new flooring in the church office since he is going to paint.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch – Jim presented the proposed recommendations for the Endowment Fund proceeds. Jim made a motion to accept the proposal. 2nd by Mike. Motion passed. Salaries were discussed for 2021. Jim made a motion to not give any raises for 2021. 2nd by Mike. Motion passed. Council approved \$500 for each Pastor and Council Discretionary Account. Candy made a motion to accept the budget as amended. 2nd by Sally. Motion passed.

New Business – Carol will be off work on November 2 and 3 for carpal tunnel surgery. Linda will be in to cover those days and she will also come in and help Carol the rest of that week.

Assistant to count offering until the next meeting is Candy Beatty.

Devotion leader for the next meeting is Judy Driscoll.

You may also call the church office at any time and leave a message, requesting Pastoral Care, and someone will return your call.

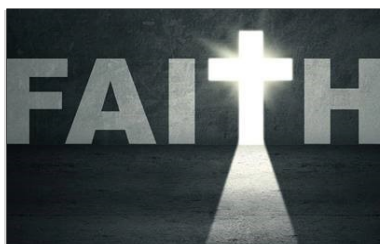

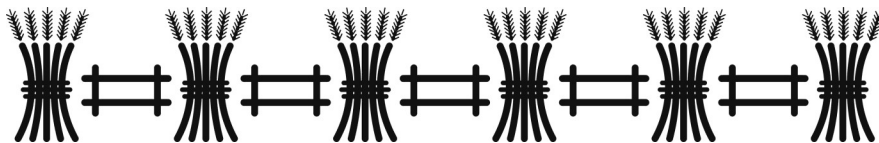

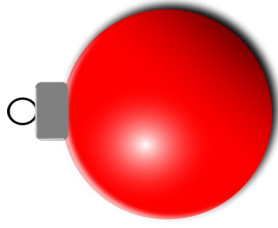
