We are never alone

The room was spare and dimly lit. We sat on folding chairs in a circle—young Honduran women and some of us from the ELCA. We had come to Honduras to observe the work of AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities). This is the ELCA's strategy to help youth who have been forced to flee their home countries because of violence, abuse, extortion by gangs and extreme poverty. *Amparo* is the Spanish word for shelter or refuge.



In this case, AMMPARO partnered with the Lutheran World Federation and the Mennonites to resettle returned migrants—those who had tried to seek asylum in the United States but had failed or had been denied and deported back to Honduras.

One by one they told us their stories of fear and desperation. Not a one undertook the long and dangerous trek north on a whim. They told us about the abuse they had suffered, about family members who had been killed by gangs, about the inability to make a living because of the extortion by organized crime. They talked about the bitter sadness of leaving home and family, and the uncertainty of the future.

I remember one young woman in particular. She was pregnant when she tried to migrate to the United States. She had the baby somewhere along the way. She was far from home, mostly alone and desperately wanted her mother to be with her. None of this is what she had hoped for when she was growing up. Circumstances beyond her control had forced her into this new and strange existence. She and her baby were now back in Honduras—but not at home. Home was too dangerous.

Remember last Christmas? Remember all of the preparations, the travel to be with family? Remember the holy beauty of the Christmas Eve liturgy and receiving Christ's grace and forgiveness at his table? The shopping and Christmas caroling? The in-person gatherings? All that has changed.

The pandemic hasn't forced us from our homes but into our homes, sheltering in place, isolated. Not together, but physically distanced. Not gathered with family and friends, but forced apart because of the threat of infection. Forced by circumstances beyond our control into this strange existence. Oh, there will be Christmas carols piped into grocery stores and other essential services, but they will be painful reminders of how life used to be.

We are reminded of the experience of the exiles in Babylon: "By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our harps. For there our captives asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, 'Sing us one of the songs of Zion!' How could we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land" (Psalm 137)?

I told the young Honduran woman about another young woman who was forced to leave home because of a government decree. She, too, was pregnant and made a long and difficult journey. She, too, was far from home and without her mother when the baby came. She had to find shelter wherever she could. This wasn't what she had hoped for when she was growing up. Circumstances beyond her control had forced her into this new existence.

That young woman was Mary and the child was Jesus. Precisely in our distress, in our dislocation, the Lord shows up. Emmanuel—God with us—makes his home in the very places we find foreign or isolating. The young Honduran woman, and all of us, can find hope because of the birth of Mary's child. There is no God-forsaken place and we are never alone—not in hospital rooms, or sheltering in place, or Zoom calls or on dangerous roads.

Many of us will not be physically home for Christmas, but we are truly home in Christ.



On behalf of the Worship and Music committee, we would like to thank Pastor Ralph and Pastor Cathy for all the wonderful messages they have been sharing with us on a weekly basis during the past Advent season. Pastor Cathy has held weekly devotions on Facebook and those who participated really enjoyed it. And even though the Christmas season is just wrapping up, we will be meeting soon to talk about the soon approaching Lenten season.

And our most heartfelt THANKS go out to Pastor Cathy, Jim Bertsch, and Carol Dahs for the idea, writing of the scripts, and all the planning of our Christmas Eve "Walk to Bethlehem" outside event. It truly was a wonderful time with around 80 people participating. And I think most people agreed that the little dusting of snow during the singing of Silent Night topped off the whole event! We need to thank all our actors and actresses too. They included Josh Miller, Cynthia Nielsen, Phyllis Nuber, Paul Warner, Mike and Angie Ramsdell, our Sunday school students, and Pastor Ralph. And of course, thanks to all of you who attended. We were really surprised at the turnout but hope you all enjoyed your time at the stable on Christmas Eve.





TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - December 17, 2020 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Dave Miller, Barb Wobser, Sally Warner, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Mike Markley, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Judy Driscoll

Meeting called to order by President, Dave Miller.

Opening devotions were given by Dave Miller.

Minutes of previous meeting (November) were reviewed. Jim made a motion to accept the meeting minutes. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for November was reviewed. Jim stated that our current fund is doing well but if we would have had a full-time pastor to pay the Trinity would be in the red. Sally made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

President's Report: Barb reported that she had the following people accept the request to be on the Call Committee: Millie McCready, Kathy Bango, Fred Wobser, and Guy Miller. Council recommend the following people for her to ask yet: Douglas Stierhoff, Cindy Nielsen, Barb or Denny Sessler, Bill Bertsch, and Adam Strean.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph stated that the new council member for 2021 will be announced at the first Sunday of the new year. They will then be installed at the January council meeting.

Faith Builders – Barb Wobser – Confirmation class has not started yet.

Property – Mike Markley – Mike stated that the following has been fixed: Emergency Exit light downstairs replaced, new flag and clasps are up, overflow area lights were updated to something more modern looking, new lights on the front of the church, reset timer on cross. Janetta and Herner are still working on sealing up the new front doors. The parsonage and church furnaces/boilers were serviced. Mike and Bonnie have looked at new floor samples for the pastor, secretary, and library. There is a piece of ridge cap missing on the north end of the church. This will need to be addressed in the spring.

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – Christmas Eve service is coming together. Pastor Cathy talked of doing a Chalking of the Door on the first Sunday after Christmas.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch – Jim stated that neither the council or pastor discretionary funds were used this year. Candy made a motion to give \$500 to The A.C.O.R.N. ministry, \$200 to Gideons, and \$300 to Grace's Table. 2nd by Barb. Motion passed.

New Business – Ushers, Lectors, and Altar Committee will roll over from last year's schedule for 2021. Care and Share sent a letter asking for help collecting certain foods for bags they are going to start passing out after the first of the year. Trinity will be a drop off stop for these items if members would like to donate. Mike will call Dunlap's and see if we can scale down the snow plowing of the back of the lot since there are no services right now.

Assistant to count offering until the next meeting is Candy Beatty.

Devotion leader for the next meeting is Mike Markley.

Adjournment and the Lord's Prayer.

Trinity is still supporting Care and Share as they find their way to operate in this new environment. We will have collection boxes available inside the church for the donation goods that Care and Share has listed below. They would prefer just the items listed below but if you have other non-perishable foods you would like to donate they will take those as well. They are ONLY taking food, nothing else at this time. If you have a donation just call the office and Carol will meet you at the church door and take your donation and Trinity will see that it gets to Care and Share. Thanks again for your continued generosity to this very needed ministry.

Letter to churches

Care and Share Inc. of Erie County, currently closed because of the COVID pandemic, is making plans to reopen in January. A cookbook featuring inexpensive and easy-to-prepare recipes has been created and has been ordered. The cookbook will be given to each client family and to area churches. Each month a few recipes will be featured and all the ingredients will be included in a box, as well as many basic items we normally provide. Since we cannot operate as a choice pantry at this time, we hope to increase interest in our new and improved boxes. Our goal is to provide ideas for healthier eating and that improved cooking skills will result.

We are now working on the challenge of providing recipe items and staples that clients do not have in their homes. Since area churches have supported Care and Share since its beginning in 1974, we are hoping members of you congregations would be willing to donate some items during this critical time of community need. 
