We are still trying to figure things out as far as Covid is concerned. We are still trying to figure out how to deal with it. Face masks, no face masks. Social distancing, togetherness. Parties, no parties. And so, it goes.

But there are also parts of our faith that are confusing as well, especially when we look at ideas of faith and our ideas of society. Our general understanding of society is like a top-down theory, or pyramid idea. There is someone at the top, the point of the pyramid. That person is the leader, and usually in control. Then as things descend, minor leaders with control over those under them, and finally the bottom, those whom have no control, and must just follow. We see this in our whole system. Even though we elect our officials, they are pretty much in control. They make the rules, and we follow.

In the older days, and still in some countries, there is the leader who sits on the seat of authority, and all must follow his orders or face the consequences.

In some respects, we in the church have a similar system. God sits on His throne on high. He makes the laws, and we are to follow. There are church leaders who have the responsibility the see that these rules are followed. They are people like the pope, bishops, denominational presidents, pastors, deacons, and the like. You obey these folks or are in some way punished. But is this really the way it was meant to be? Yes, I, know that we need parameters and guidelines and some sense of order, but is this what Jesus did and taught?

Remember, when the people wanted to make Jesus their king, he left the place. His leadership was to show people how to care for one another. There were no higher ups or lowly nothings. All people counted and were to be included. Those who were outcasts as well as those who were leaders received his attention and ministry. Jesus sets the example as to how we are to lead. We are to minister to those who the rest of society ignores. We are to reach out and welcome those who have been rejected by others. We are to be concerned about the health and safety of others. This does not seem to be happening in regard to the pandemic. It seems to be, "It's my way or the highway." If we love one another as much as we love ourselves, then we should be doing everything we can to protect the health and well-being of those around us even wearing masks. Lord, make us instruments of your love.

Meeting called to order by President, Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Jim Bertsch.

Minutes of previous meeting (June and July) were reviewed. Candy made a motion to accept the June meeting minutes as submitted. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed. Judy made a motion to accept the July meeting minutes as submitted. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for June and July were reviewed. Candy made a motion to accept the June treasurer's report. 2nd by Barb. Motion passed. Barb made a motion to accept the July treasurer's report. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Call Committee is still interviewing candidates as they are presented from the ELCA. Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph thanked council on the update that someone has been using his name in spam messages to solicit gift cards for various "church needs". Council suggested that the police be notified so a report could be placed on file. Carol will take care of this.

Mission Service – Judy and Barb delivered the art supplies to Luther Home of Mercy. They were so grateful for all the supplies. Judy is looking into doing another type of collection for them. Pork & Kraut Dinner will be November 7.

Property – Mike Markley – Mike presented the quotes for the new Educational Wing outside doors. Barb made a motion to accept the bid from Janotta & Herner for \$10,541 for the doors and \$1018 for the safety coating. Funds to be taken from the Building Improvement fund. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed. Judy made a motion to accept the bid of \$1284 from Hobbs to put new door hinges on the doors at the back of the church at the top of the stairs. 2nd by Sally. Motion passed. Mike will look into getting someone to brick up the hole in the chimney where the ash cleanout door was.

Stewardship & Finance – Jim Bertsch – Jim will transfer \$10,000 out of the Current fund, since it has a high balance, into a more interest accruing account.

Witness and Welcome – Bonnie Lieb – Bonnie asked that an update of the Call Committee be put in the newsletter as she has had several requests from members on the status.

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – September 12th service will be at 9:00 am only. It will be a busy day with it being Rally Day for Sunday School, First Graders will receive their bibles, there will be bags for fill for GWOH, and Blessing of the Bookbags.

Old Business – Trinity's new website will go live on August 31st. Carol and Cathy Wobser will have training on how to edit the site on September 1. Barb made a motion that council reconsider Brainiacs for at least a few months of service. 2nd by Mike. Motion passed.

New Business – Facility Use form from Cindy Norman was approved. The 2020 Financial Audit needs to be completed. Carol will see if previous volunteers will do this year's. This year's Congregational meeting is set for October 24 at 2:00 pm. Positions up at the end of 2021 are Community Mission, Property, Stewardship & Finance, Witness & Welcome, and Worship & Music


