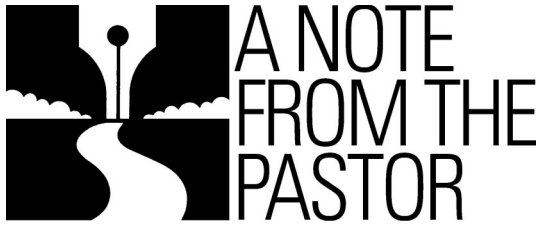

Well, we got through January. We were pretty lucky as far as the weather is concerned, getting dumped on only in the last week. So now it is time to move on to February.

As far as the Church Year is concerned, we will still be in Epiphany for the whole month. Ash Wednesday doesn't come until March 2. However, we will be remembering the death of Martin Luther. As Lutherans, we carry his name. We remember the story of the 95 theses, the event that began the Reformation. We remember the agony he went through as he battled the establishment. At one point, he even had to seek safety in a castle. It was there that he translated the Bible into German, so that it could be read by the common people.

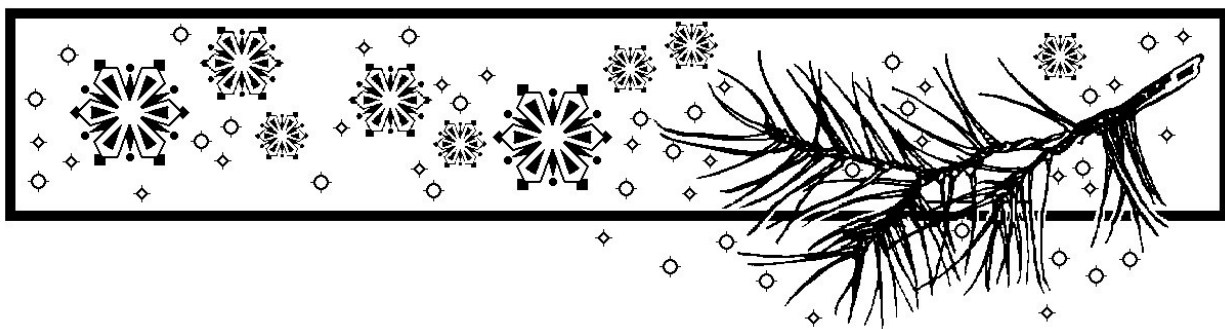
I think we sometimes forget some of the things he brought to the church. As mentioned above, the idea that the Bible should be translated into the language of the people. Thus, we have the Bible in English for us, so, that we can read and study it. The Bible can be read in many languages because of that idea.

Also, he worked on the idea that Holy Communion should be available to the lay people in "both kinds" Thus, as lay people, we can receive both the bread and the wine, not just the bread.

Pastors were permitted to marry.

I know we usually think of these things on Reformation Sunday in October, but perhaps it good for us to remember them on his death as well. He, and other reformers like him, gave us the church that we have come to cherish. However, we must remember that just as back in that day, the church continually needs to reform and change as the times change. While we need to maintain the fundamentals of the faith, as did Luther, we need to continually adapt them to the changing culture, to continue to make them relative to the next generations. Otherwise, the Church will simply fade into the past, and the Christ whom we adore will become a thing of the past. As the church of the Reformation, we must continually be looking at ways we can make the message of the Gospel relevant to the times in which we live. We must continue to seek new ways, in this modern changing world, to proclaim that Jesus Christ is the Savior, and that we all need to share the love which he has given us.

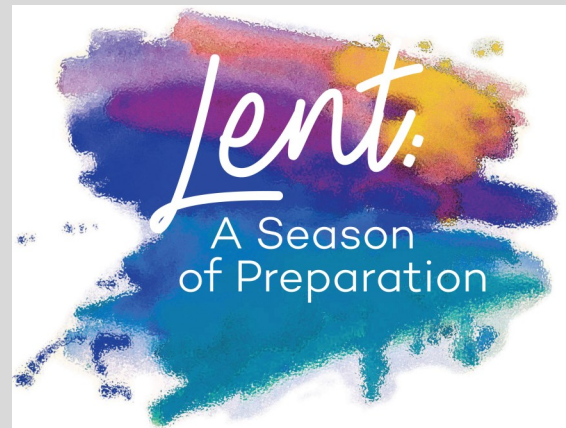

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - January 20, 2022 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Carrie Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Nancy Vollmer, Pastor Ralph, Betsy Stierhoff, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Millie McCready

Meeting called to order by President, Carrie Wiedenheft. Opening devotions were given by Carrie Wiedenheft

Minutes of previous meeting (December 2021) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the December 2021 meeting minutes. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for December 2021 was reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie talked with Guy Miller and the Call Committee is hoping to see some more movement around Lent. Henry Siebert explained that the Synod is still interviewing candidates for Trinity, but they have not found a good match so send to us for interviewing. The counters and devotions signup sheet for the year was passed around. Nancy nominated Candy as Vice President for 2022. All of council seconded. Motion passed. Candy accepted this position again.

Congregational Life – Candy Beatty – Approximately 40 little treat bags were given out at the December 26, 2021, service. Some leftovers were given to Crossroads and Care & Share. Candy made a motion that the Bereavement Committee be moved under the direction of the Congregational Life Committee until there are enough volunteers to run it on its own again. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed.

Faith Builders – Carrie read a letter from Sally Warner stating that she will be retiring from the paid position of Youth and Family Coordinator effective March 3, 2022. Her letter stated that she would be willing to stay on as a volunteer doing the same job for the time being if Trinity so chose. After discussion Candy made a motion to accept Sally's generous offer to volunteer to cover this position. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed. Carol gave an update on the activities happening with the youth for February. They will be selling their soup and subs for Souper Bowl Sunday on February 13. Proceeds will go to Victory Kitchen and Project Share. The kids will be collecting cans of soup for the month of February. They will put these with a bowl, crackers, and a prayer card and give them to Grace's Table. Starting in Lent the kids and any members who want them will be given a bank to collect change during the Lenten season with this money going to the Tornado Fund.

Mission Service – Betsy stated that she got with Judy Driscoll and discussed what Judy had on the position and some possible thoughts for her. They talked about trying a hog roast outside and fellowship.

Property – Gary and Mike Lieb were in and fixed a leaking toilet in the basement. Jim is hoping it was the culprit to the water bill that was 4 times higher than normal.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim stated that he had spoken with Steven Patterson about our investments. Steven will do some readjusting of them.

Worship and Music – January 30 will be a lay-led service at 9:00 am only. Pastor Cathy is working on the Lenten schedule. Nancy stated they are looking for suggestions to help increase our attendance. There have been a couple of complaints that it is hard to hear the speakers in the back of the church. It was suggested that one of the extra microphones be added to the lectern. We will see if it helps. Their next meeting will be February 23.

Old Business – Sally, Bonnie, and Jim have the pictures for inventory done. Sally will type up the listing that they made and then she will get with Carol, and they will download the pictures and listing to flash drives and get them to the insurance agency. Carol has about half of the financial audit guidelines type. She will have these done before the February council meeting so that hopefully the audit can take place before then also. Trinity's variance request for the 5 year rope change on the elevator was approved. Jim will check with Care and Share and see if they want the color printer that is not being used on Carol's desk.

New Business – Jim suggested that Trinity be listed under the church section of the Saturday paper. He and Carol will look into what it costs and work on listing Trinity in it. The winter weather policy will be put back in the bulletin and newsletters. Carrie will talk to Pat Wiedenheft and possibly Greg Norman about filling in for 2022 year in the Faith Builders position.

Adjournment made by all. Motion passed. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

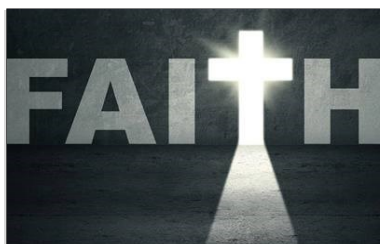

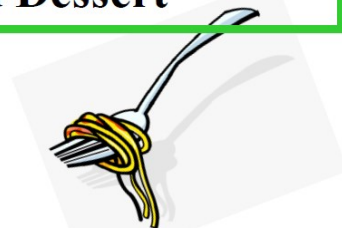
