

for I have come down from heaven, not to do my will, but to do the will of him who sent me.


Psalm 34:1

COUNCIL Update

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - April 21, 2022 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Carrie Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Nancy Vollmer, Betsy Stierhoff, Pat Wiedenheft, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Millie McCready

Meeting called to order by President, Carrie Wiedenheft. Opening devotions were given by Betsy Stierhoff

Minutes of previous meeting (March 2022) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the March meeting minutes. With the correction of the spelling of acolytes. 2^{nd} by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for March 2022 was reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Pat. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that the Call Committee did a second interview with a candidate. However, they withdrew themselves from Trinity's consideration before it could be taken to council. Pastor Seibert hopes to have another candidate soon. Barry Gill submitted a letter to council stating that he has a personal conflict with being able to be here each Wednesday evening for the N/A group. Council discussed and decided to let the groups meet without a church member being present to supervise the building. A check list will be created to help the two N/A leaders remember what needs to be done before leaving the building. If issues arise this will be revisited.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph asked if we had anyone to attend the Synod Assembly this year. Currently we do not. Dave & Cathy Wobser have done it the last few years for us. We will try listing it in the bulletin and having Pastor Cathy announce it at Sunday's worship service.

Congregational Life – Candy's group will be putting together some sweet treats for Mother's Day.

Faith Builders – Sally has information on a program for Vacation Bible School. Dates for this have yet to be determined.

Mission Service – Betsy will get together with Jim and Bonnie on the logistics of a spring BBQ meal. Betsy received some information on a program from Funds2.org on collecting shoes for the needy. She will gather more information on this.

Property – Protegis Fire & Safety was in and certified the fire extinguishers for 2022. The one in the boiler room will need to be replaced in 2023. Mike Markley will contact Clearview Tinting on having the bullet proof tint added to the new outside educational doors. Trinity received a quote from The Glass Guys on replacing the seals on the upper educational wing windows for \$1,504. Pat made a motion to except this bid. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed. Carol will contact them to let them know they can start this when it fits in their schedule. Gundlach was in and certified our backflow device for 2022. Heart Start Defibrillator has had a new battery and pads installed. It was tested and is ready to go. Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch reported that Trinity received the donation from Charles Wiedenheft's estate of \$207,745.69. From this donation Jim made a motion to send \$10,000 to LWR for the Tornado victims, \$10,000 to LWR for Ukraine, and \$7,000 to our local Habitat for Humanity. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed. Jim will line up a meeting with Edward Jones on proposals for how to handle the rest of the money. A thank you will be sent to Mary Ann Wiedenheft in acknowledgement of Charles generosity to Trinity. We received a \$1000 check from Thrivent Charitable Impact & Investing. Carol will return Affidavit of Charitable Organization to them.

Witness and Welcome – Carrie will contact Millie and see if this position is going to work for her or if she would like to be removed.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer reported that they are looking at a Homecoming activity in the fall to help people return to church (similar to a Rally Day). It was asked if we would go back to communion at the rail. This will be discussed at the next meeting on May 3.

Old Business – Carol has delivered a flash drive with our inventory information on it to Firelands Insurance. There is also a copy in the fire cabinet in Jim's office. Carol is still working on typing up the Financial Audit Guidelines. COVID protocol will be discussed at the Worship and Music Meeting. Carol will call The Glass Guys and see if they have done the estimate for the storm windows for the sanctuary yet. Nancy Vollmer, Sally Warner and possibly Bonnie Lieb volunteered to be on the board for the Patterson Scholarship. Need to have Mike Markley follow up on the approved concrete for the front entrance to the sanctuary.

New Business – Carol contacted Brainiacs and had them help with the sound problem on the video laptop. It currently is fixed. We do need more volunteers to help do the videos if Cathy Wobser is unavailable. Carol needs to check the carillon. It was supposed to ring before services on Sundays and it doesn't seem to be doing that.
