Ahh, summer has finally arrived. It's almost like breathing in new life. For the past couple of years many have shared that they feel like they have been firing on all cylinders for the past two plus years, working around the clock to give others the support needed during this confusing and stressful time. And it has been exhausting!

As I've been attending the various synod assemblies, one of the things we have been doing is checking in with people. It has been amazing to hear the stories. First, we always hear how excited people are to be back together and then stories of how they were able to cope or not the past couple of years. Often, people will talk about how the lack of socialization over the past couple of years has affected their children and people at work and the current layers of outcomes we are currently seeing in the world. We can't wait to get back to normal is a common comment made. I hear the same response from members in our congregation.

As I've been listening, the song Funky Town by Steven Greenberg keeps playing in the back of my mind. If you don't know the song – check it out – the beat will make you smile. Some of the lyrics are:

Gotta make a move to a town That's right for me Town to keep me movin' Keep me groovin' with some energy Well, I talk about it, talk about it... Talk about movin'...Gotta move on... Won't you take me to Funkytown?

And don't we all want to move on? A couple of weeks ago, we read the gospel lesson from Luke 8:26-39 about the man who didn't really have a name but was called by his disease, Legion. Once Legion was healed, he wanted to move on to a more normal life with Jesus and learn more about being a disciple. Instead, Jesus told the newly healed man to stay in the community where he had encountered all kinds of social distress. He was

called to model Jesus' love so others might catch the same vision of caring for all people and moving them closer to the promised reign of Jesus.

Sure, wouldn't it be nice to move on, but we are called, just like the newly healed man to stay and listen and show others – even the ones that forget our name – a more perfect way that has been given to use through the death and resurrection of Jesus. As we walk with others, how can we find time and space that will help us to be our best tomorrow? I know, a lot is going on in the world today! So we pray that through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we keep moving with the energy of God's promise toward the cross of Jesus, proclaiming all the God has done for us.

Bishop Daniel G. Beaudoin was elected May 21, 2016, to a six-year term as the bishop of the Northwestern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). He was installed on July 23, 2016, at St. Mark's Lutheran Church, Bowling Green, Ohio.

Daniel is married to Rachel, and they are blessed with three children: Joshua, Elijah, and Hannah. 2 daughters-in-law: Michelle and Chelsie. They are smitten with their grandchildren: George, Homer and Evelyn.

Bishop Beaudoin served as the pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Stony Ridge from 2004-2016. He served as the pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Edon, Ohio, from 1996 to 2004. From 2013-2015, he served as the Dean of the North Central Conference.

Bishop Beaudoin earned a Bachelor of Arts in History from Oakland University in Rochester, Mich., a Master of Divinity from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio, and a Master of Arts in Medieval History from the University of Toledo in Toledo, Ohio.

Bishop Beaudoin enjoys running with the Toledo Roadrunner's Club, reading good books, studying Scripture, and eating Mediterranean food.

Dear friends,

The last time I wrote to you about the war in Ukraine, Lutheran Disaster Response and our partners were taking in an influx of Ukrainian refugees. The United Nations reports that over 6.5 million people have left the country and an additional 7 million are displaced within it. Your gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response have already been at work as we responded to this crisis.

One inspiring ministry you support is Mandák House, a church in Budapest, Hungary, with a long history of helping vulnerable populations, especially the Roma people in the area. Since the first refugees from Ukraine arrived in Budapest in March, the staff and volunteers have dedicated themselves to supporting them. Over 600 volunteers receive such donations as clothing, bedding, toys and hygiene items, and distribute them to refugees.

Like many of our partners, Mandák House has watched its response to the refugee crisis evolve. The people of Ukraine now need a different kind of support, beyond immediate relief supplies. Staff and volunteers at Mandák House are helping refugees place their children in schools, find jobs, take language classes, access the health care system and integrate into the community.

"With different phases, you have to be flexible and change your focus," said the Rev. Márta Bolba, pastor of Mandák House. "We are really flexible and needs-oriented. We should continue this flexibility because people need different things in different phases of the war."

Of course, this is just one story from Eastern Europe. Our partners and companion churches in Ukraine, Poland, Slovakia, Hungary, Moldova and Romania are accompanying refugees every day and addressing their various needs.

## COUNCIL UPDATE

#### TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - June, 2022 - 7:00 pm

#### (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Nancy Vollmer, Betsy Stierhoff, Pat Wiedenheft, Millie McCready, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Carrie Wiedenheft

Meeting called to order by Vice President - Candy Beatty. Opening devotions were given by Carol Dahs

Minutes of previous meeting (May 2022) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the May meeting minutes with the correction that under Stewardship and Finance the figure of \$277,437.25 should have been \$315,437.25 from the Charles Wiedenheft estate. Also, Carol's vacation time was for June not July. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Millie. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for May 2022 was reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Pat. Motion passed.

President's Report: Candy reported that the Call Committee did an online interview, and that the candidate would be in next week for an in-person interview.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph asked if we had a fire protocol and if people knew where fire extinguishers were. Also, asked about our gun protocol. Do we have signs up? Suggested maybe locking all doors 10 minutes after the service has started.

Congregational Life – Candy's group will be giving out chocolate bars to the gentlemen of the church for Father's Day.

Faith Builders – Pat reported that the kids would be singing on June 19<sup>th</sup>.

Mission Service – Betsy and Carol applied for Thrivent Action dollars of \$250 to help cover the cost of the Father/Son/Daughter Gathering. They are looking to play the movie Encanto for movie night. Bring own drinks/snacks. Betsy talked of getting flavor packets for bottled water and doing popcorn. They need to discuss where the money raised from the shoe fundraiser will go yet.

Property – Mike Markley will contact Clearview Tinting on having the bullet proof tint added to the new outside educational doors. We are still waiting on a quote from The Glass Guys on the storm windows for the sanctuary. They are working on it. Pricing some for another place and they are looking at trying to order it all at once to save on shipping. Shipping is very expensive. The Glass Guys are waiting for the seals to come in so they can do the upper windows in the educational wing. Need to get with Mike Markley on the approved concrete work from 2021. Carol texted Mike on the cigarette butt holder to see if he could fix it.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim will start the collection of the LWR Personal Care kits in July. We need to put an announcement in the July bulletins and newsletter.

Witness and Welcome – Millie gave us an update on the health of a member.

Worship and Music – Nancy has Gary Lieb set up to train any new bell ringers that volunteer. Pastor Cathy will help with the teaching of the new acolytes. Nancy's group is still working on the Homecoming/GWOH Sunday events. Should fellowship time be brought back? Jim made a motion to take the loose plate offering on July 24 to help support the Seminary Leadership Training. A total of \$500 will be donated in Bishop Daniel's honor. The balance will come from current. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Millie. Motion passed.

Old Business –Carol has gotten more of the Financial Audit Guidelines typed up. Computers were updated per the approved agreement with Chime Technologies. Brainiacs was cancelled. Carillon is now playing on Sunday mornings. So far no complaints.

New Business – Robin Pratt was in and tuned the piano on May 26. Muller Pipe Organ was in on June 7 and tuned the organ. State Elevator Inspector was in. Elevator passed inspection. Carol is working on getting the record retention up to date for 2022. Carol presented 3 new office copier quotes. Candy made a motion not to except any of the copier quotes and approve up to \$200-300 for a new stapler for Carol. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Millie. Motion passed. Candy's group will put together a small fellowship time for between service on July 24 for Bishop Daniel's visit. A donation to Seminary Leadership Training will be made in Bishop Daniel's honor.
