COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - September 13, 2022 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Millie McCready, Carrie Wiedenheft, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Betsy Stierhoff

Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft Opening devotions were given by Nancy Vollmer

Minutes of previous meeting (August 2022) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the August meeting minutes. 2^{nd} by Jim. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for August 2022 was reviewed. Pat made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that the Call Committee has had nothing new to report. Council nomination letters were mailed on September 9 and so far, one has been returned.

Congregational Life – Candy Beatty – There were 57 served at Gwen Miller's funeral dinner.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – Pat reported that there will be Sunday school on October 23 even thought the congregational council meeting will be held then. Trunks for Treats will be October 30. The Senior Thanksgiving Dinner will be November 20. The Sunday School Christmas Program will be December 11 during service. Sunday school will still be held in December. Sally is looking at a possible VBS for a day during Christmas break.

Mission Service – Betsy Stierhoff – Jim reported that we had 500 pairs of shoes now. Bonnie will get with Carol on putting together a flyer to drop off at Grace and the UCC church in Castalia and Zion Sandusky, to see if they will help collect shoes. A letter was sent to Wal-Mart Fremont to see if they would help in any way.

Property – Mike is going to rent a lift and fix the roof cap on the north end of the church. Mike will see if the Glass Guys want to use it to put the sealant on the upstairs windows. The sealant is now in. Mike will also talk to the Glass Guys about the storm windows on the sanctuary. They may need to use the lift to look at the windows and see if any work needs to be done before storms could be installed. The push pads on the portico entrance have been installed. The security film on the east outside educational wing doors has been completed. Gentleman was out today and gave a quote of \$175 to wash the educational wing windows. Mike will coordinate the use of the lift with them also. Mike is still looking at having the approved concrete work outside the east sanctuary doors done yet this fall. Dunlap Snow Removal submitted a new contract for 2022-2023 snow season. Prices are up due to his cost for salt and fuel. Pat made a motion to accept his contract pricing. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch - LWR personal care kits have been completed. 112 kits were assembled. They will be taken to Pemberville on October 8. There were 2 ideas submitted for the Endowment Fund Proceed this year. They will be reviewed at the next Stewardship and Finance meeting. There currently isn't a great amount in the Endowment Fund Proceeds this year. The budget for 2023 needs to be worked on.

Witness and Welcome – Millie McCready – She has been making calls and sending cards out.

Worship and Music – Reformation Sunday (October 30) Bishop Daniel will be here. There will be two services as normal with communion being given. There will be no Thanksgiving Eve service this year. It will be included in the November 20 service. December 7 at 7:00 pm will be the only Advent service. Christmas Eve will have only one service at 7:00 pm with communion. Christmas day will be a carol service with one service at 9:30 am. New Year's Day will also only have one service at 9:30 am. December 11 will be the children's Christmas program during worship service. Nancy made a motion that all the Sunday's in December be one service at 9:00 am with communion on December 4 and 18. 2nd by Jim. After discussion a second motion by Nancy was made to move the services to 9:30 am. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed. There were 64 in attendance for service on GWOH's Sunday. We received 8 to 10 sets of items of people's secular talents that were given to Care and Share.

Old Business - Carol still working on the Financial Audit Guidelines. Our emergency procedures were discussed and deemed at current to be sufficient.

New Business – A membership review committee was setup with Millie, Jim, Pat, and hopefully Sally Warner. Carol will get them the reports they need to work on this. Cindy Norman submitted a fellowship hall rental for April 20, 2023. Nancy made a motion to accept this request. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed. Carol stated that there isn't much use of the recycle bin in the church office anymore. Jim made a motion that we discontinue this service. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed. Carol will get this cancelled.
