

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Lutheran Church—

Recently, while attending a fall theological gathering, a group of leaders were sitting around the table and the questions was asked: "What do you want people to say about you when you're dead?"

There were some giggles and groans; before I proceed, I went on to explain: "What do you want to be known for? What do you want people to remember about you?" We were asked to list 5 things. Before you read on, think about that for yourself. What do **you** want people to know or think about you?!

Actually, the question was a great way to get at our core values; these are the things, the values that are important to us. They define who we are. And who we are shapes what we do. It's true for individuals and it is true for congregations. Perhaps the more important question is not what people will think about us, but <u>"What does God think?"</u>

Pastor Dave Daubert who lead the group talked about the "6 P's of Vital Churches": Purpose, Principles, Priorities, People, Plans and Practice.

#1) **<u>Purpose</u>**: Any person or a church needs to have a purpose. Why are we here? Why are we doing what we do? What does God want us to do? Articulating a Purpose often involves formulating a mission statement. Daubert emphasized that a good mission statement needs to be short, concise and easily remembered. A mission statement is most helpful when it is clear and guides decision making. Perhaps it is time to update what we have as a mission statement.

#2) **<u>Principles:</u>** How are we to act ideally? What values are we living out? What do we really care about? When we are at our best, living up to our vision, what is observable about us? What are people saying about us? Some core values that I heard when we gathered at our tables – do any of these describe Trinity?

+ Spiritual growth through prayer, worship, Bible study and fellowship.

+ Nurturing the participation of children and youth, through spiritual growth and service.

+ Faithful stewardship and being cheerful, generous givers of time, talent and treasure.

+ Service to the community, here and abroad, and seek to address needs of hunger, clothing, shelter, medical care and safety for those in need.

+ Care of the environments in which we gather, worship and serve.

+ Ministry done by members and friends in their daily lives outside the church.

+ Spiritual, emotional and physical well-being of our members and provide support through life's challenges.

The question becomes: **are** we acting this way? Can others see the principles and values that are important for us? Are there any principles from the list above that are missing or ones that really don't describe us?

#3) <u>**Priorities**</u>: What will we focus on? What does God want us to do now? What areas should we be addressing to strengthen the congregation to make a difference in the world? What are the best applications of our energy and talents to connect purpose and principles?

- #4) **People**: Who will do it? Who are our partners?
- #5) **Plans:** What actions do we need to take?
- #6) Practice: Make it happen!
- The first three P's are about the <u>content</u> of mission; we need to be clear and articulate why we're here, how we act and what we want to focus on. The central question for us to answer is: **Why does God bring us in and why does God send us out?**
- As we continue in the call process, we need to talk more about who we are and what it is that we want to be known for in the community. More importantly, we need to share our vision for mission! I know, values and priorities are a challenge to identify but ultimately, it leads to holy change. And I think, it is the type of change that God is calling us to be about.

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - October 20, 2022 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Millie McCready, Betsy Stierhoff, Carrie Wiedenheft, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Pastor Ralph

Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft Opening devotions were given by Betsy Stierhoff

Minutes of previous meeting (September 2022) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the September meeting minutes. 2nd by Pat. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for September 2022 was reviewed. Candy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reached out to the Call Committee members to see if they would like to continue to be on the committee since it had already been two years since starting. Several stepped down and the Call Committee now consists of: Guy Miller, Millie McCready, Candy Beatty, Greg Norman, Mike Markley, and hopefully either Gayle or Natalie Thompson. These will need to be approved at the Congregational Council Meeting. There may be a candidate to interview soon. Pat made a motion to accept the Congregational Council Meeting Agenda. 2nd by Nancy. Motion Passed. Betsy made a motion to accept the new council election ballot as submitted. 2nd by Pat. Motion Passed. It was discussed on what to do if no quorum was made at the Congregational Meeting. It was decided to reschedule the meeting that day if there was no quorum.

Congregational Life – Candy Beatty – There will be a small fellowship time between serviced on October 30 when Bishop Daniel is here.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – Pat reported that there will be a small Christmas tree outside the Pastor's office collecting items for Project Share. There will be an overnight cardboard box sleepover at the church on November 12. The kids will attend church the next day. Pat made a motion to allow a box to be placed in the sanctuary with a couple of kids there to collect money for Project Noelle. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed. The Senior Thanksgiving meal will be November 20 at about 11:45 am. There will be a signup sheet for this. The Sunday School Christmas Program will be December 11 along with First Communion. There will be a Helping Hands tree again this year.

Mission Service – Betsy Stierhoff – 40 bags of shoes were picked up by Funds2org on October 15. The balance will be picked up later. It was agreed to offer poinsettias again this year for the holiday season. The Sock/Underwear tree, Good Gift's tree, Helping Hands Tree, and the Project Share tree will be done again this year.

Property – Still waiting on quote from The Glass Guys on storm windows for the sanctuary. Still waiting for the concrete work out front to be done. Still waiting on the windows to be cleaned. Mike fixed the roof cap on the north end of the church. The Glass Guys were out and replaced the upper seals on the windows in the educational wing.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch -Nancy made a motion to accept the 2023 budget. 2nd by Pat. Motion passed. Betsy made a motion to accept the 2023 Community Mission allocations. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed. Millie made a motion to approve \$500 from the Mission Endowment Fund to send to Cancer Services for transportation use. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed. Millie made a motion that the rent for the parsonage be increased to \$700 at the first of 2023. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed. A letter will be written to the renters informing them of this decision along with the notice that it may increase again later.

Witness and Welcome – Millie McCready – Millie, Jim B., Pat W., and Sally W. looked through the list given to them on inactive members. Jim made a motion to accept the letter that was drafted and will be sent to these members. More information on the holiday schedule will be added to the letter. 2nd by Millie. Motion passed.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer – The next Worship & Music meeting is scheduled for November 2. There are three new acolytes that will go through training. They are Mya & Lincoln Smith and Claire Conner. Eli Conner will also be added to next year's schedule. Those doing First Communion this year are Tyler Wiedenheft, Lincoln Smith, and Maci Berg.

Old Business – Carol will get the typed up Financial Audit to those who have participated in the past and see about getting it edited now. We will need three volunteers to do the audit in February of 2023. Carol purchased a new electronic stapler for \$57.00. The council had approved \$200 to \$300. It seems to be working well. This motion was made in June: *Jim*

made a motion to take the loose plate offering on July 24 to help support the Seminary Leadership Training. A total of \$500 will be donated in Bishop Daniel's honor. The balance will come from current. 2^{nd} by Millie. This will be done on October 30 when Bishop Daniel is here finally.
