God of new beginnings,


we confess that we have not welcomed your holy reign.

You are the light of the world.


A city on a hill cannot be hidden.



God of promise, your goodness is everlasting. We give thanks for the lives of the faithful who now rest in you. We trust that you will bring us into the company of all the saints with rejoicing. God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

God of our longing, you know our deepest needs. By your Spirit, gather our prayers and join them with the prayers of all your children. In Jesus' name we pray.

DEVOTION Week 1 - HOPE

The first candle on the Advent wreath symbolizes hope. We all need hope. Without it, we fall into despair and feel the pull of self-destruction. God gives us the promise that he will never leave us and that, through Jesus' death and resurrection, we are his beloved children forever. This hope gives us strength and courage to face the world on its most challenging days. This week, please center your devotional life around hope using the following suggestions.

Simple ways to practice hope:

- Take photos of things you find hopeful. Consider sharing one on the church Facebook page.
- Write or draw a list of signs of hope. Considering sharing it with a friend.
- Make a plan (even a small one!) for the future.
- Look up "hope" in the dictionary. How is God's hope like and not like this definition?
- Read a Bible story (such as: 2 Kings 4:8-37 (The Woman from Shunem), John 8:1-11 (The Woman Caught in Adultery), Ruth 1-4). Where do you see hope in it?
