Advent 3 – Technology and distractions



Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, silence, reflection, and song.

Today our young people are the ones who will bring the Word of God to life through word and song! Please journey with them as they make a joyful noise to share the hope of Advent and Christmas.

Reading One: Psalm 100

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing. Know that the Lord is God. It is he that made us, and we are his, we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him, bless his name.

Reading Two: Luke 2: 1-7

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her first born son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Reading Three: Luke 2:8-14

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flocks by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!

(Congregation joins in singing after it is played through once)

Hark! The herald angels sing, Glory to the new-born king. Peace on Earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled. Joyful, all you nations, rise; join the triumph of the skies; With angelic hosts proclaim, Christ is born in Bethlehem! Hark! The herald angels sing, Glory to the new-born king!



Reading Four: Luke 2: 15-20

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So, they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child who was lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Reading Five: The Song of Mary

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. For you Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed.

You, the Almighty, have done great things for me and holy is your name.

You have mercy on those who fear you, from generation to generation.

You have shown strength with your arm and scattered the proud in their conceit, Casting down the mighty from their thrones and lifting up the lowly.

You have filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty.

You have come to the aid of your servant Israel, to remember the promise of mercy, the promise made to our forebears, to Abraham and his children forever.

SONG: Away in a Manger

(Congregation joins in singing verse 2 and 3)

The cattle are lowing; the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes. I love you Lord Jesus, look down from the sky and stay by my cradle till morning is nigh.

Be near me Lord Jesus; I ask you to stay close by me forever and love me, I pray. Bless all the dear children in your tender care and fit us for heaven, to live with you there.

Reading Six: John 1:1-5

In the beginning was the Word, and Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

SONG: Silent Night

(Congregation joins in to sing the last 2 verses)

Reading Seven: Matthew 2:1-2 8-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we have seen his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage." But Herod sent the Wise Men to Bethlehem saying, "Go and search for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them went the star that they had seen at its rising until it stopped over the place where the child was. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Draw near to us, O God, as we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy through Jesus Christ, Emmanuel. **Amen.**


The Lord's Prayer
