## On the Cover...

"Dear Jesus, could you please send me a Bible!" was the desperate plea of one half-starved boy from a village in the Henan Province. But this was communist China in the 1970's; there were no Bibles where he lived, and those caught possessing one would be tortured, if not killed. However, so deep was the longing this young boy had for the Word of God that he began to fast and plead with God, day and night. His family thought he was losing his mind, but he did not give up. One hundred days later, God answered his prayer in a miraculous way and sent him a Bible.

He only had a third-grade education. He could barely read simple Chinese. Using a dictionary, he painstakingly looked up one Chinese character at a time, treasuring every word of Scripture. Day after day, whenever he had a break from his work in the fields, he would secretly steal away to pray and read his Bible.

Finally, after reading through the whole Bible, he went back to the New Testament and started to memorize it, one chapter at a time. Then he began to share it with others.

Now known as Brother Yun from the book *The Heavenly Man*, this young boy went on to preach the gospel to many starving souls in China. Many house churches were started, amazing answered prayers were seen, and thousands have been won to Christ.

When I read testimonies like that of Brother Yun, I often ask myself, Do I really recognize the treasure I've been given in the Word of God? Is spending time in prayer and meditating on God's Word more precious than all my earthly pursuits?

Job said, "I have treasured the words of His mouth more than my necessary food" (Job 23:12).<sup>1</sup>

Jeremiah's testimony was, "Your words were found, and I ate them, and Your word was to me the joy and rejoicing of my heart." (Jeremiah 15:16).

Today, the Bible is the most widely published and translated book of all time. Yet, despite it being more accessible than it has ever been in history, we have lost our appreciation for this priceless treasure. We have also forgotten our need for earnest prayer. Truly, we are experiencing the famine spoken about by the prophet Amos, "Not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD" (8:11b).

I love this inspirational thought: "The Bible is God's voice speaking to us, just as surely as if we could hear it with our ears. If we realized this, with what awe we would open God's Word and with what earnestness we would search its precepts. The reading and contemplation of the Scriptures would be regarded as an audience with the infinite One."<sup>2</sup>




When was the last “aha” moment you had? You know, that moment when something You Have been wondering about suddenly comes to light, like the light bulb in a comic strip when the comic character suddenly gets an idea or comes to some realization.

I am sure that most of us have had at least a few of them.


The strongest one I had was when I finally realized I was being called into the ministry. I thought I was going to be a mechanical engineer like my dad, my uncles and my brother. I received the Navy Scholarship and was at the Town School of Engineering at the University of Pennsylvania. When we were on our summer cruise, I was confused by the Ship’s Chaplain. He was always on an inspection team. He was often times harder than the Captain. I couldn't understand why a chaplain would be doing that. When we were at Guantanamo Bay, our last stop before returning to the US, on Sunday, several of us went to the chapel services on the base. The chaplain there was so different than the one who was on board ship. It was at that time that my course in life changed. I felt that God was calling me into the ministry. I decided that I would graduate and serve the required service for the scholarship, go to Seminary, and then return as a Navy Chaplain. While it didn't work out that way, it was one of the epiphany experiences that changed my life. (One of my shipmates realized that something had happened.)

We are in the Season of Epiphany in the church year. It is a time when we remember the “aha” experience of those first Christians as they realized who this Jesus is. While we confess that Jesus is our Lord and Savior, may we remember He changes lives, not just teaches right from wrong. May we have that “aha” or epiphany experience that truly sees Him, and really changes who we see ourselves to be.

You may also call the church office at any time and leave a message, requesting Pastoral Care, and someone will return your call.

# COUNCIL UPDATE

## TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - January 16, 2020 - 7:00 pm (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Meeting called to order by President, Dave Miller. Devotions were given by Dave Miller.

Business of Visitors to Council: Council introductions were given to Pastor Ralph.

Minutes of previous meeting (December 19) were reviewed. Jim stated that the tree at the parsonage did not fall on the garage but onto the parsonage driveway. Barb made a motion to accept the meeting minutes with the correction. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Judy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for December was reviewed. Jim stated that the Thrivent quarterly report arrived too late to distribute to council. Jim will get with Steven Patterson on the transfer of the \$10,000 from checking to the Thrivent Bond checking. Steven only transferred \$1,000 instead of the \$10,000. Also, the Endowment distribution of \$7930 was pulled from the incorrect account. Judy made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Barb. Motion passed.

President's Report: Dave has just a couple more job reviews to do and those will be done. Council approved Sally Warner as the Vice President for 2020. Candy Beatty will cover if Sally is unavailable. Discussion of the transition team followed. It was decided that Dave (President) and Barb (Council Member) would be on the transition team. Council was taxed with finding 4-5 more people of varying ages to be on the team. Those who have questions about what it involves need to talk to Dave.

The Congregational Care Ministry team – Barry's team was able to visit almost all of Trinity's shut-ins in December. A Pastoral Guideline system was setup. Thank you to Barb Wobser for being our Congregational contact. They will be meeting on January 20 to make plans for the next round of visits and communion.

Congregational Life – Candy Beatty – There were 120 who participated in Pastor Gardner's farewell luncheon. Candy's team has decided to continue with the Unity Service brunches and so there will no longer be the summer picnic or Christmas party. Funds from those will be used to purchase supplies for the luncheons.

Faith Builders – Barb Wobser – Souper Bowl and Subs will take place on February 2. The Shrove Tuesday Pancake supper will continue on February 25. Sixteen boxes and 3 bags of cereal were collected from the youth's pajama party. The cereal was donated to a family in Castalia.

Mission Service – Judy Driscoll – They will be meeting on February 11 at 6:30 pm.

Property – Mike Markley – Carol reported that Travelers Insurance was in and checked the boiler. It is good for another year. A facility use form for December 27, 2020 was approved.

Stewardship and Finance – Jim Bertsch – They will be meeting soon with Steven Patterson to address any changes for 2020.

Witness and Welcome – Bonnie Lieb – She is just getting going in this new position to her.

Worship and Music – Sally Warner – Sally reported that things for worship are pretty well set until Lent.

New Business – Barb volunteered to help Carol with a retention policy for old newsletter, bulletins, and donation envelopes. Carol will put in the bulletin a reminder to all that they can submit announcement and prayer requests to her for listing in the bulletin. Barb made a motion to accept Glenn & Patty Bango into membership through reaffirmation of faith. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Candy. Motion passed. There will be a simple First Communion welcoming for Mason Hermes. The signup sheet for devotions and money counters was distributed. Pastor Ralph stated that he and Pastor Cathy will do the midweek Lenten services following what is in Sundays and Seasons. Dave will work on getting lectors for those Wednesday evenings. Candy and her team will put together a signup sheet for a simple supper prior to the worship service. The Congregational Life team will host the Ash Wednesday meal. There will only be evening services available for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Judy will call Amanda at Stein Hospice about whether or not Trinity will provide any meals to hospice families this year. Sally, Barb, and Judy have discussed some remodel thoughts on updating the office area for a future pastor. Council decided to give Pastor Gardner the deadline date of February 20, 2020 to have his office cleaned out.

## Ash Wednesday is February 26 this year.

We will continue our tradition of offering a simple, light meal before the 7:00 pm Lenten service each Wednesday. We served between 35 and 40 weekly last year, with the meal starting at 6:00 pm.

Dear Church,

Through full communion, we have grown in unity and fellowship over the past decade with the United Methodist Church (UMC). We are receiving and sharing gifts, strengthening the body of Christ, and deepening mission and ministry for the sake of the world.

Last week, in a flurry of misleading headlines, many of us read that the United Methodist Church had split. *This is not, in fact, what happened.* On Jan. 3, it was [announced](#) that an ideologically diverse group of leaders collaborated in a mediation process resulting in their unanimous support for a proposed agreement. If adopted, the [Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation](#) would result in the separation of the United Methodist Church. At this point, it still needs to come through the appropriate legislative mechanisms in order to be deliberated by the UMC General Conference in May. The proposed agreement is just that at this time.

Many of you may be pondering the good Lutheran question: What does this mean? For the UMC? For our full communion partnership? It is simply too soon to have clarity on those questions. I assure you that there are leaders, both ELCA and UMC, who are carefully and faithfully tending to these questions. My staff colleagues and I are in regular conversation with our counterparts. As actual decisions are made by the General Conference and details become clearer, we will share information and seek to interpret it.

For now, I invite your continued prayers for, and accompaniment with, our full communion partners. Reach out to your neighbors and let them know that you are walking with them and praying for them, for the unity of Christ's church, and for God's justice and peace for all people and creation. This is a time for deepening our commitments to the relationships at the very heart of our bond as siblings united in Christ.


