



I cannot believe it is November already! My mind is already racing toward holiday preparations – who is coming – who is going – and maybe we'll just stay at home again this year! Thankfully, the church year helps us to at least pause and focus on the One we wait for during our seasonal preparations.

On November 7th we will celebrate All Saints Day, a time when we rejoice and are glad in the salvation we have as Believers, that those who die in faith still live in Christ. And then as the month progresses, we will hear of the widow of Zarephath, a story of famine in our current season of harvesting and Thanksgiving. How can it be that in a country over-stuffed with food, millions still go hungry? Yes, it is so easy for us to forget that all we have and all we are is a gift to us from God. So I wonder, if it is not your tradition, maybe during this season, you might offer a prayer before eating your meal. The prayer can be simple, even as simple as *Amen* (which means, thank you). Yes, a simple prayer to remind us that all that we have, all that we eat, is given to us from God. Our family dinner prayer is:

*Come Lord Jesus,
be our guest,
may all we have and do
be blessed. Amen.*

But as you know, we receive so much more than just food. Everything we have, everything that has been done for us by Christ is a gift. Okay, maybe you might want to add a couple more prayers to your day to offer thanks! So how about Martin Luther's evening and morning prayers. His prayers cause us to remember, as we begin and end each day, that all we have is given to us by God's grace. In each of these prayers, Luther helps to remind us of all that God has done for us through Jesus. Take a moment and pray Luther's morning prayer.

Luther's Morning Prayer:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Amen.

Luther's Evening Prayer:

I thank you heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have this day so graciously protected me, and I beg you to forgive me all my sins and the wrong which I have done, and by your great mercy to protect me from all the perils and dangers of this coming night. Into your hands I commend my body and soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy Angel be with me, that the wicked one have no power over me. Amen.

Luther's evening prayer is my favorite. Both *prayers* remind me that my entire day and night rests in the hands of Christ and for that I give thanks. In Luther's evening prayer, I am reminded that only in God will I be kept safe as we all wait for the coming of the child. And that reminds me – the last Sunday of this month then moves us into Advent!

May this month be one of prayers as we all offer our thanks for the bounty we find on our tables and may we be moved to share with those not as fortunate.

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL
Meeting Highlights - October 21, 2021 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Carrie Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Barb Wobser, Mike Markley, Sally Warner, Judy Driscoll, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance:

Meeting called to order by President, Carrie Wiedenheft. Opening devotions were given by Bonnie Lieb

Minutes of previous meeting (September) were reviewed. Barb made a motion to accept the meeting minutes as submitted. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for August was reviewed. Jim stated that two of the Mission CD's renewals came due between council meetings so one he renewed for a two year term and one was renewed for a one year term. Sally made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie was asked by Henry Seibert of the Synod to make some clarifications to Trinity's MSP. She was instructed not to take it to the call committee for time reasons. Carrie reviewed the changes that she made, and the Synod has approved and new changes and have updated Trinity's post. Candy made a motion to accept the proposed agenda for the congregational meeting with the addition of a request for volunteers to do the 2021 Financial Audit in February of 2022. 2nd by Sally. Motion passed. Mike made a motion to accept the council chair ballot for the congregational meeting. 2nd by Judy. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph stated that last Sunday's service was supposed to be videoed live but unfortunately the computer did not want to work. Cathy Wobser will try again this Sunday. Pastor Ralph and Pastor Cathy thought it would be good for Trinity to have a pastor in the office a few hours each week. Pastor Ralph will do this on Monday and Wednesdays for a couple hours each morning, pending any personal priorities. Mike made a motion to accept this proposal. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

Mission Service – Judy will be getting with Sally on a project for the Luther Home of Mercy for the holiday season. The pork and kraut dinner is on and will be drive thru only.

Property – Mike Markley – A big thank you to Ron VanZandt who bricked up the old chimney cleanout hole and did not charge the church. Hobbs said the door closures are in they just need to schedule when to come do them. The new educational wing doors are all in but a latch. Once that is in, they will schedule the replacement of those doors. Mike will schedule Gundlach to come check the boiler and radiators for the winter season. Mike spoke with Gardner Insurance on how they prefer to have items that are inventoried for our insurance records. They prefer video or pictures of the items with a description of how many.

Worship and Music – On October 31 at 10:30 service Trinity will have four youth making their Confirmation: Eli Conner, Natalie Thompson, Erica Miller, Lila Warner. Pastor Cathy is looking into doing some sort of service/devotional/meal during the mid-week advent season. The ELCA Good Gifts tree will be done again with Jim's help. December 12 is scheduled for the Sunday School Christmas Program. Council decided that there will be no Thanksgiving Eve service this year.

Old Business – Judy made a motion to accept the 12 months for \$180 proposal from Mark Adverting for our website support. 2nd by Mike. Motion passed. The 2021 Financial Audit was reviewed. Barb passed out the guidelines for the records retention policy. She has everything done to current. Barb stated that she had started on the inventory for the church. However, her stickers were not staying very well and was looking for council's approval to order actual inventory stickers. This brought on a discussion of how Trinity should do inventory. It was felt that it needed to be videoed or pictures taken and not such a detailed inventory be done. With this change Barb said she would not continue on with doing the inventory.

New Business – On 9/17/2021 State Inspectors were in for an unscheduled elevator inspection. We passed. Trinity will continue to pay supply organists out of its budget. If Adele is off for more then two weeks, then Council will revisit this. Carol asked about the rational of mailing out monthly newsletter. It was decided to put an announcement in the bulletin and the remaining 2021 newsletters that we would be phasing out the mailed copies. The newsletter can be emailed out to those who would like, or it can be looked at on our updated website. There will be some paper copies available for pick up at the church. There will still be a need to mail some, and those people will need to let the church know who they are. There will be no cardboard city this year for the youth. The kids are doing a Hungry Meal project. Sally asked if she could use some of the VBS funds to purchase some shrink wrap bags to put blankets in. These would be given to the police and fire departments to use as needed for those in need. Jim made a motion that she could purchase roughly a dozen bags. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.
