





Am I so into those things that I rush the season in order to enjoy those benefits? I want to start before Halloween, so that I can enjoy all the fun a little longer, forgetting what Christmas is all about. Am I so exhausted by all this month-long pre-Christmas hype, that when the actual day comes, I am too exhausted to really remember and enjoy what the day is all about?

And then, when it comes to the real Christmas Season, (Christmas to Epiphany), I am tired of all that stuff and want to move on.

Let's make sure that through all the hype, we remember what Christmas really is all about and celebrate the love that God has shown us through the gift of His Son.
May you all have a blessed Christmas season.



COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - November 18, 2021 - 7:00 pm (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Carrie Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Sally Warner, Judy Driscoll, Bonnie Lieb, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Mike Markley, Barb Wobser

Visitors to Council: Nancy Volmer, Betsy Stierhoff, and Phyllis Nuber

Meeting called to order by President, Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Sally Warner

Minutes of previous meeting (October) were reviewed. Jim made a motion to accept the meeting minutes as submitted. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for October was reviewed. Jim stated that the \$9000 from Mission Endowment was dispersed to the approved recipients. Sally made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Bonnie. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie has not heard anything from the Call Committee since our last meeting. The annual Congregational Meeting Minutes were reviewed, and it was decided to pull the voting count numbers out of the minutes. Dave Wobser and Linda Gantz have volunteered to help with the 2021 Financial Audit in February of 2022. Carrie spoke to Greg Norman and Rex Stierhoff about the Property chair position. They both declined but Rex said he would help if it was needed. Betsy Stierhoff accepted the Community Mission chair starting in 2022. There will be a Thanksgiving Eve Lay-Lead Service here at Trinity with Grace in Castalia.

Mission Service – Judy Driscoll - The pork and sauerkraut meal made \$1572 with 144 meals being made. The money from Thrivent covered almost all of the food costs. Sally and Judy are working together on our Helping Hands tree for the Luther Home of Mercy this year.

Property – Carol submitted a Facility Use Form for December 11. Council declined approval of the request. Carol will let them know and return their check.

Worship and Music – Sally reported that Pastor Cathy will be doing a mid-week Advent devotion service. Dates are December 2, 9, and 15. They will have some devotion time and then do a craft at the first two services. On the 15th they will be caroling at some of our shut-in's houses. Christmas Eve service will start at 6:45 pm outside at the nativity scene and then move inside by 7:00 pm. Jim asked about doing an 11:00 pm service to help spread out the amount of people at one service. Sally said she would ask Pastor Cathy about it. December 26th will have only one service at 9:00 am. January 30, 2022 will be a fifth Sunday of the month so it will be a lay-lead service. Sally will put together a special mailing for December to explain all of the events going on for the month. Jim made a motion to take \$250 of the Council Discretionary Fund to help Project Share (Tiffany Fisher) with a few more kids they would like Trinity to sponsor. 2nd by Judy. Motion passed.

Old Business – Sally and Jim will work on taking pictures for inventory for insurance after the first of the year. They will have this completed by the end of January 2022. Carol has gotten some feedback on people responding to how they would like to receive their newsletter starting in 2022.

New Business – Candy Beatty volunteered to do the December offering count to replace Barb. Carol asked if council had any issues with her recreating our baptismal, confirmation, and membership certificates to print on the big copier. With this change the small printer will not be needed anymore. Jim made a motion that we donate the printer to a charity that could use it. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed. Carol will get some picture to Jim and Phyllis and see if they can find someplace to take it. American Home Elevator was in and did an inspection. It was brought to Carol's attention that there is an old law that is being enforced now that states we must change the ropes (cables) on our elevator every two years instead of the current five. This cost approximately \$1600 each time. They said there is a variance that can be applied for which if approved would take it back to every 5 years for the life of the elevator. If this variance is approved, it would cost Trinity \$200 for the variance. Council decided to do the variance and see if we can get it approved. Carol has the paperwork and will get that submitted.
