As we gathered in Columbus, Ohio, a few weeks ago, where the first constituting convention was held in 1987 – and where the Reverend Herbert Chilstrom was elected as the first presiding Bishop of what was to become the largest Lutheran denomination in the USA – it caused me to pause.

As I looked around the room and saw the passion and commitment still present, I was humbled to see such dedication. I was on internship that summer when the first constituting convention took place and got to attend that historical moment in the life of our church. A lot has changed over the past 35 years, not only the way we do business but also the way we share our faith.

A couple of words came to mind as I reflected on what took place at our most recent churchwide assembly: Renew, Reconcile, Respond. I was reminded that the Church is constantly being renewed as young adults entered the conversations and came with a new set of eyes and vision. We are also a Church of Reconciliation, we are reminded once again of God's grace to move us to seek forgiveness, and to admit our own sins in the way we have treated our fellow brothers and sisters in the faith. And we are called as a Church to take seriously the need to respond to the actions of the world and what is going on around. The assembly acted on several items: passing amendments, voting for a new vice president, etc. And of course, worship was spirit filled through lament and celebration. These things may not seem earth shattering, but they are some of the small ways we respond to God's grace, mercy, and work in the world.

I see some of the same work that was done at the churchwide assembly as part of our call here at Trinity. We are also called to carry forth our witness to the surrounding community by renewing, reconciling, and responding. So let me ask you, according to a tool called Congregational vitality, they suggest that vital congregations that are open to change are known for their strength in three areas:

- they have a strong relationship with God
- they have strong and healthy relationships with one another
- and they accept God's call to be in relationship with the world.

How do you think we do in these three areas? Maybe it is time for us to sit down and have this conversation together as we prepare for a new pastor. May these questions give you pause too as you reflect on them.

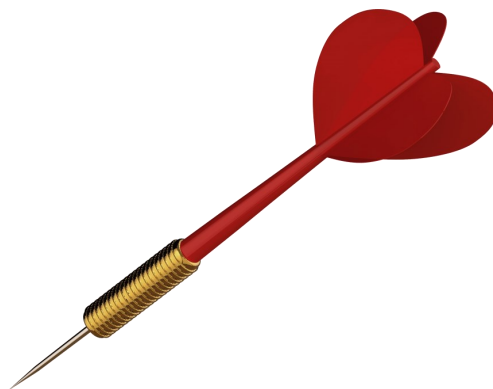

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - August 18, 2022 - 7:00 pm

(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Candy Beatty, Pastor Ralph, Nancy Vollmer, Betsy Stierhoff, Pat Wiedenheft, Carrie Wiedenheft, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Millie McCready

Meeting called to order by President – Carrie Wiedenheft, Opening devotions were given by Betsy Stierhoff

Minutes of previous meeting (July 2022) were reviewed. Pat made a motion to accept the July meeting minutes. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for July 2022 was reviewed. Jim noted that the second installment of the Community Mission Fund was dispersed. Betsy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that the Call Committee is working on setting up a mock interview to see if the interviewee can help us determine where we need to change our interview process. The Call Committee asked council to have each person give 2 to 3 reasons why a new pastor should come to Trinity. The Call Committee currently has no one to look at. Open council chair positions for 2023 include: President (2 year term), Congregational Life (2 year term), Faith Builders (2 year term), Property (2 year term). Three volunteers are needed to be on the Nominating Committee to work on getting volunteers for the voting ballot to fill these positions. Candy Beatty has volunteered to be on the committee.

Faith Builders – Pat reported that Sally has spoken to the two Sunday school teachers about starting up this September. Roy Patterson will be doing Confirmation with Pastor Cathy's help. Pat will check with Sally on if she will send a letter out to all youth who are eligible for Confirmation.

Mission Service – Betsy reported that there were approximately 30 people at the Family Movie Night. It seemed to go well may try it again later in the year. The shoe fundraiser has gathered in 275 pairs of shoes. Betsy dropped off the letter asking for help in our shoe fundraiser to the Norwalk Walmart. She hasn't heard anything back yet. Carol will put together a letter for the Fremont Walmart. It was suggested that Betsy check with the high school and confirmation kids to see if they could help with the pork and kraut meal if it was to be done. Betsy is looking into a game night for some time this winter.

Property – Clearview tinting is scheduled to be out on August 23 to put the film on the educational doors. Mike will contact Stanley Technologies on the push pads that were not installed (but paid for) at the portico entrance. Stewardship and Finance – LWR personal care kits have been coming in at a good rate. Jim has \$250 from Thrivent to fill in whatever is needed to complete as many kits as possible.

Worship and Music – The letter inviting all to the September 11 Homecoming was mailed out. On Sunday pieces of paper will be given to all who come to church to put down what their hands do that is God's work, our hands. Looking for people to bring in samples of the secular or professional lives that shows their GWOH to be donated within the community. Worship and Music's next meeting is September 7.

Old Business – Carol still working on the Financial Audit Guidelines. Candy passed out a page on things to be considered when looking at the safety of Trinity. Nancy made a motion that all council members look this over and come up with suggestions/corrections to this by next council meeting and then all members are to be trained on what is decided. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed.

New Business – Bishop Daniel will be coming to Trinity on October 30. Nancy made a motion that this fifth Sunday be changed back to two services with communion. 2nd by Candy. Motion passed. Carol put the Growing In Faith (The Diakonia Program) in the bulletin for Sunday. If there are any takers council will then decide if Trinity will pay for fees for these individuals. It was done in the past for one participant. September's council meeting was changed from September 15 to September 13 since Carol will be on vacation on the 15 and 16. Nancy made a motion that the Congregational Meeting be set for October 23 at 9:15 am with there being no Sunday School. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed.

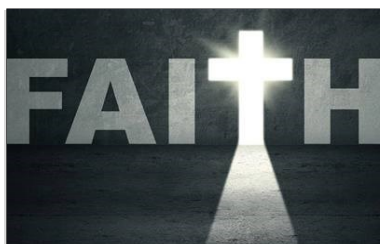
