

Whether you give up something, or give something, let us remember that is an action that shows our appreciation and thanks for all that Jesus has done for us.

Have a blessed, faithful Lent.





TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - February 16, 2023 - 7:00 pm

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Millie McCready, Betsy Stierhoff, Carrie Wiedenheft, Pastor Ralph, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Kathy Bango

Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Pat Wiedenheft

Minutes of previous meeting (January 2023) were reviewed. Nancy made a motion to accept the January meeting minutes. 2^{nd} by Pat. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for January 2023 was reviewed. Jim moved \$20,000 from the checking account and opened a 6 month CD through Edward Jones at 4.45% interest rate. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that the Call Committee does have a name to discuss and see if they want to pursue an interview.

Pastor – P. Ralph is going to be back in the office on Mondays and Wednesdays starting in March.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – There will be a day camp for the youth on Monday, February 20.

Mission Service - Betsy Stierhoff - She will try and connect with Jim and Bonnie this Sunday between services.

Property – Stanley came and fixed the automatic portico door on January 20, 2023. Gundlach has been in a few times to fix some minor things on the boiler. Travelers Ins was in and checked the boiler and it passed for another year. J&H was out and put some weather stripping on the outside of the two new front sanctuary doors. Jim said they seem to be helping so far. They also caulked under the new educational wing doors to help with the rain coming in under the doors. Jim stated that the cross at the end of the building is not lighting up. He will look at the timer upstairs and see if we need to have someone else look at it.

Stewardship and Finance -Jim Bertsch – New signature form was sent to Thrivent. The financial audit was done on February 11. There were just a couple little things that Shannon and Carol will look into but overall the audit went well. Dave Wobser and Millie McCready did do a watch of the Sunday donations being counted on February12 as part of the audit guidelines. Everything there went well.

Witness and Welcome – Millie McCready – Millie tried to visit Norm Stierhoff, but he was not in his room. She was able to see Paul Wiedenheft for a short while.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer – Nancy attended the Good Friday meeting at Zion. Zion is looking at doing something from 1-3pm on Good Friday. They invited Trinity members who wanted to join the choir that day to do so. There will be a small soup meal at 6:00 pm prior to the Lenten Services at Zion.

Old Business – Carol is working on getting the new directory listing ready for printing. Denise Casanova freshened up the outside nativity set. She did not charge the church for this. It looks very nice.

New Business – A facility use form was submitted and approved for use on March 12. It was agreed to once again put Easter Flowers for sale in the bulletin. It was suggested that we list events happening at the LOMO (Lutheran Outdoor Ministries in Ohio) in the bulletin. Carol received a notice on a recall for the pads on the AED unit. She completed this and returned the paperwork. New pads will be sent free of charge. It was then discussed that we need to make more individuals aware of where our first aid equipment is and how to use it. Pat made a motion that we set up some training for the AED. 2^{nd} by Nancy. Motion passed. Carrie will contact Gayle Thompson and see if she would like to help us get this done. It was asked that we get more people to run the video computer, preferably at early service so when the kids sing this could be included. Printed instructions would be very helpful. Carol will contact Cathy Wobser about this. It was discussed about putting the bulletin and songs on the screen. Again, volunteers are need to run this.
