First Reading: Acts 10:34-43

hear our prayer.



Devotions for the Resurrection of our Lord Called to Resurrection

Texts: Matthew 28:1-10 (Acts 10:34-4; Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24; Colossians 3:1-4 or Acts 10:34-43)

Theme: Going ahead of you

Christ is risen! Alleluia! Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia! Who would have thought that joy would come out of sorrow - for you, hope out of despair - for you, life out of death - for you? But here we are. We know that our Redeemer lives and at the last, Christ will stand upon the earth, and we shall see God! Alleluia! And so now we truly live in the space between no longer and not yet. No longer does death have the final word. Not yet is this fully realized. In this unfinished time, we who are cross-marked and Spirit-sealed live our lives practicing resurrection in everyday life. We dwell as the presence of Christ amid this broken and hurting world. We proclaim the good news of God whose love is unconditional and unending. We strive for justice and peace in all the earth in all that we do, all that we say, and all that we are. And in and through it all, Jesus back from the grave, risen to die no more, goes ahead of us along the way, giving us the assurance that there is nowhere we will go where Jesus is not there with us and nothing we will experience that Jesus will not experience too. With this hope and this promise, we daily live this unfinished life, trusting that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of God, so too shall we walk in newness of life, day in and day out, until the "not yet" is no longer and all will be as God has promised.

Reflect upon how God is calling you to practice resurrection

- How do my values inform how I practice resurrection?
- How does practicing resurrection invite, encourage, or challenge me to be open?
- In what ways am I called to practice resurrection?
- How does practicing resurrection inform my attentiveness?
- In what ways does practicing resurrection impact my regrets?
- How does practicing resurrection influence where and how I experience God's presence in everyday life?
- Who am I called to be? What am I called to do? Why am I here?
- What do I need for this season?

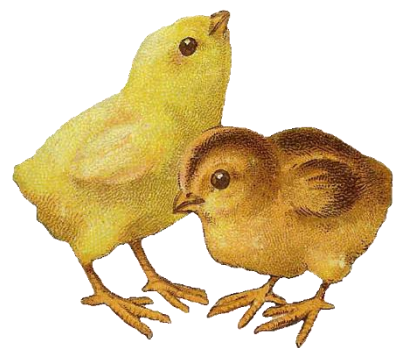
