“And Jesus came and said to them, ‘All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age’” (Matthew 28:18-20).

During the next few Sundays of the Easter season, we will be continually reminded about the new life we have in Jesus through his death and resurrection. And through the stories of Easter, we will hear over and over again how our faith in God’s mercy and forgiveness changes lives and continues to be at work every single day. We know the gospel changes lives and that God’s power and grace are real and at work today. And the exciting thing is that we get to share this gift. I bring this all to your attention because I truly believe that one of the gifts that Trinity brings to the whole church is your work with children. The support, time, and affirmation that this congregation gives to our children is outstanding. Sally’s team not only shares time with our youth during Sunday School and other activities, but they also involve them during worship. This is what a community of faith does together. And I want to say thank you for this very important ministry. COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - April 27, 2023 - 7:00 pm (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Jim Bertsch, Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Kathy Bango, Carrie Wiedenheft, Pastor Ralph, and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Betsy Stierhoff and Millie McCready

Meeting called to order by President – Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Carrie Wiedenheft

Minutes of previous meeting (March 2023) were reviewed. Jim made a motion to accept the March meeting minutes. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for March 2023 was reviewed. Jim noted that all three investment funds were back up for the quarter. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that the Call Committee does have another virtual interview coming up next weekend.

Congregational Life – Kathy Bango – Kathy reported that she received 8 paper surveys and 17 online surveys. Council was pleased with the responses. She reviewed the stats from the surveys. Recommendations from these surveys will be discussed in the coming months.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – April 30 will be a kids' service. Grace Lutheran Church invited Trinity (and First Congregational Church) to participate in their Bible School on July 10-13 from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. There will be a cost of \$10 per child. Trinity may pay this expense or see if the kids can do some fund raising to cover the fees. Trinity will oversee the music portion of the Bible School. Mother's Day on May 14 will have a breakfast for mother's and children. There will be a signup sheet on the bulletin board. There was a request to bring back the cookie social hour between services. Worship & Music will discuss this at their next meeting and work with the Congregation Life committee on seeing if it can be done. The last day of Sunday School for this session will be May 28.

Mission Service – Betsy Stierhoff – It was decided to run the Grace's Food Pantry collection for a few more weeks since we haven't gotten too many donations yet. The group is looking into a Brown Bag Lunch activity at the park with the city's gathering in June or July. August would be a collection of school supplies for local teachers and maybe in October collecting for the Lutheran Home of Mercy along with the Lutheran World Relief kits that are usually done.

Property – Council hopes to get some updates on the work that we would like to see done in the upstairs fellowship room. Jim stated that the parking lot needs to be resealed this year. Last time it was done it cost \$3600. We currently have \$2500 in the parking lot fund. Carol will contact Mike Markley on this.

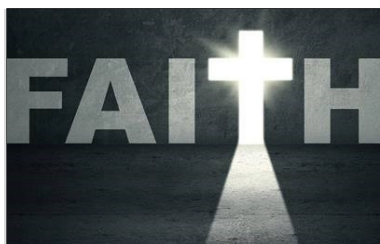
Witness and Welcome – Millie McCready – There was a request for Millie to contact Ron & Marilee Werner. Carol will talk to Millie about it.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer – Their next meeting is May 10. Nancy presented a handout with several different Parish Nurse options and programs that are being done. Council needs to read through these and be ready to discuss their thoughts at the next council meeting. Zion is starting up a program. Jim will see if he can get a contact name that Nancy can call and see if we can collaborate with them. It was decided to see if we could get enough interest to get an adult ministry program going. Nancy will contact some members and see if she can get some participants.

Old Business – Carol is working on getting the new directory listing ready for printing. Carol still needs to try the laptop computer for videoing the services and get together instructions for setting the computer up for it. There are now Glucose Gel packets in the first aid areas upstairs and downstairs.

New Business – Jim made a motion to accept the transfer of Chet and Penny Solem to Woodlands Lutheran Church in Mount Verde FL. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed. Jim made a motion to approve the transfer in of Sam and Linda Wilcox from Chapel Of The Cross church in Saint Peters MO. 2nd by Pat. Motion passed. Pastor Cathy is looking at doing a new member service on May 21. Council approved the use of the fellowship hall for the bible study group with Barb Wobser. Carol will post and add to the bulletin and newsletter the request from the Post Office to "Stamp Out Hunger" by donating food. Donations can be left by individual's mailboxes on May 13 and the post office will pick them up as they deliver the mail that day. Council approved the use of the fellowship hall for Cindy Norman and a small group to practice a skit they are working on. There also was a request for having an AA meeting here at Trinity on Wednesday's at 4:00 pm. Brad will come to the May meeting to present this to council. Jim made a motion to add Carol to the signature form at Key Bank since they no longer want to answer her questions on deposits without her being on the form. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed.

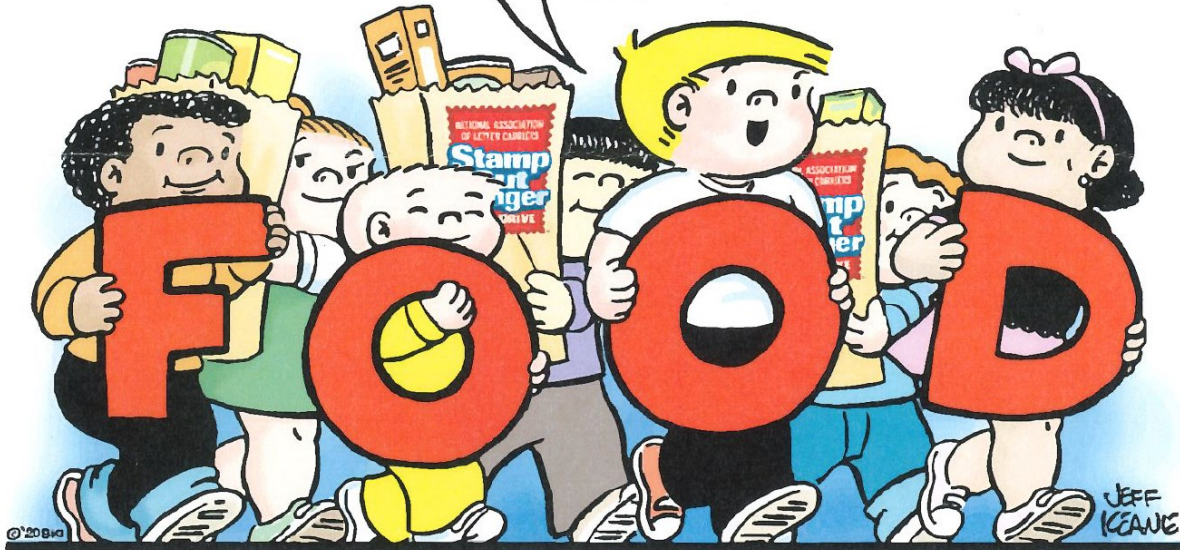
