



In the recent "Living Lutheran Magazine", Bishop Eaton wrote an article entitled, "Who is a "Real" American?" In it, she talks about the fact that she lives in a very diverse community. She says that in her community, 90 languages are spoken. The stores have both kosher and halal foods. People walk the streets in jeans, saris, and yarmulkes. She said that one day she had been working hard in her yard all day. As she was finishing up, she noticed a woman coming down the street, so she tried to clean the sidewalk so the woman could get through. However, the woman stopped and handed her a meal for her and her husband. She told her that she had seen her working hard all day, and thought she needed a break. It was the time of the Feast of Ramadan, when Muslims fast all day, and eat in the evening. She had seen Bishop Eaton working all day and prepared the extra meal for them.

Bishop Eaton commented there has been an awful lot of hate speech and violence in our country lately against those of different ethnic backgrounds. She said there has been increased polarization in our country as well as in the church. She raises the question, "Who is really American and/or Christian?"

I think you and I have seen this as well. Look at the violence around us. We read about it every day and see it on the news. We see it in our government and our communities. Perhaps some have even seen or experienced it in person. As we see it happening in the church, we might ask, "Who are the real Christians?" Just because we attend church does not necessarily mean that we are Christian. We show that we are followers of Christ by how we live and act to other human beings. Do we bring dinner to someone we have seen that has been working hard all day, even though they may be of a different ethnicity or religion? As we see the division and anger going on in our culture today, are we working to fix the problem, or are we part of the problem? Pray that God would give us the strength and faith to be fixers, and not the problem.

Wreaths Across America is a non-profit organization that seeks to place a fresh wreath on each Veterans grave in the United States at Christmas time. Last year over 2.7 million wreaths were placed on graves in all 50 U.S. states.

This year, The Community Mission Team, along with the members of Trinity have become sponsors for this organization. And it has been decided to start our kick-off of selling these wreaths with a "CHRISTMAS IN JULY" theme.

We would like to sponsor at least 60 wreaths as this will cover the number of veterans' graves in the Venice cemetery. And of course, any extra will be used to make sure every veteran has a wreath at their grave on Christmas.

There are different ways you can contribute. 1. Donate any amount of money to go towards the purchase of the wreaths. 2. Sponsor a wreath for \$17.00 or sponsor 2 wreaths and we will receive 1 wreath free.

There are Sponsorship order forms by the Christmas tree outside the church office for you to take and fill out or fill one out now and leave it in the box by the tree. All the information is on these order forms so please take time to read it over. If you would like a wreath placed at a grave site for someone who is not in the Venice cemetery or even in the state of Ohio, make sure to fill out the Special Requests section at the bottom of the sponsorship form and they will make sure to get one on your special grave if you cannot do so yourself.

We will be doing this project until the 1st of November, but we thought we would start out early so you aren't adding this to your Christmas shopping list and expenses.

COUNCIL UPDATE

TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - June 15, 2023 - 7:00 pm (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Betsy Stierhoff, Pastor Ralph, Jim Bertsch and secretary, Carol Dahs. Not in Attendance: Carrie Wiedenheft, Kathy Bango, and Millie McCready

Meeting called to order by Vice-President – Nancy Vollmer, Opening devotions were given by Jim Bertsch

Minutes of previous meeting (May 2023) were reviewed. Pat made a motion to accept the May meeting minutes with the spelling correction from isle to aisle under the Worship & Music minutes. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for May 2023 was reviewed. Jim did the transfer of another \$25,000 from the checking account to a CD earning 5.15% interest. Betsy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Pat. Motion passed.

President's Report: Pat reported that the last candidate interviewed with the Call Committee would like to interview in person with Council. This is currently trying to be set up.

Pastor's Report: Just a note that attendance has picked up the last few months. We are very grateful.

Congregational Life – Kathy Bango – Kathy reported last month that she has gifts for fathers on Sunday.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – Currently there are no new volunteers to help with the altar committee. The kids will be helping with the Father's Day event. Jim made a motion that the \$10 fee per child for Grace's Bible School be paid for by Trinity for any of their members who wish to go. 2nd by Betsy. Motion passed.

Mission Service – Betsy Stierhoff – Betsy is hoping to have a meeting on June 25 between services. Betsy to talk with Sally on what she has for the Race Across America in December.

Property – Mike has the Glass Guys coming out to measure windows and provide a quote for a plex type material for storm windows on the stained-glass windows. He also has Window Creations providing a quote for actual glass. Hula started work on the concrete June 13. They expect to pour concrete on June 16. Mike will get with Bonnie and Barb on the fellowship hall upstairs. Mike asked for directions from council on what they wanted to see done to the room. Council decided they would like to start with painting the ceiling and the block walls but not the wooden walls. Privacy window coverings so you cannot see into the rooms and maybe carpet. Mike is working on a quote to seal the parking lot. Gundlach was in Thursday and checked the ac unit that was not working. They changed out a capacitor. Gundlach will be back out on July 5 to service the rest of the ac units.


