



The congregation has left the building! That was one of the themes for our small groups at the Rostered Ministers Gathering this past week in Phoenix. Yes, it was hotter than hot - so that meant that people stayed for all the activities rather than checking out the sights! Anyway, we gathered in small groups to begin thinking a little deeper about what it means to reclaim the gifts of baptism in this work that God has called us to do.

If you think about it, Jesus did almost nothing in the temple; he was almost always on the streets and in the local communities. Jesus did not baptize anyone that we know of, and he only celebrated Holy Communion once. However, Jesus did teach -a lot! And Jesus was constantly providing for the needs (food and healing) of the people he encountered in his daily life.

Equipping all of God's children for the work of ministry begins by helping one another see the ways that God is already at work in and through our daily lives – *outside of the congregation.* For example: how many of us have seen someone who is facing more medical issues than any of us would ever want to face, barely able to get around, but yet, this person continually expresses love and concern for those around them. How easy it would be to withdraw from the world when one is facing so many hardships. Yes, God is always at work through us – if we would just take a little time to notice!

So how do you relate to people beyond the church?

We are all part of the priesthood of all believers. And maybe – this is one way we can not only share our faith but also help to revitalize and find renewal in our congregation. What a great way to lift up the gifts that we all bring as God continues to work in and through our daily lives to provide daily bread for our neighbors.

Another question: How might we as a congregation become more intentional about listening to people's stories from daily life and supporting them in their service to neighbors in the arenas of family, school, work, local community and beyond?

All of this is important stuff if we want our congregation to stay relevant! We need to keep finding new ways to share our faith. If we don't meet people where they are at in life – how can we expect them to come through our church doors?

I offer this prayer for us to use as you contemplate the questions above: O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown Give us faith to go out with good courage not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. 
