Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

It has been a beautiful welcome to join you here. Thank you again to all who have made these first weeks so memorable and lovely.

This month we will celebrate the gift of Holy Communion with some of our young people for the first time. This is a

gift of God's grace offered to all those who are baptized. Grace is something that is freely offered without any conditions. You don't need to understand, earn, or even deserve it. It is just a gift. God has chosen to love us, forgive us, delight over us, and feed us with mercy. All we can do is open our hands to receive and be amazed by God's grace. Awhile ago, there was this idea that if you celebrated Holy Communion too much, it would lose its "specialness" and I understand the sentiment. God' grace is indeed a special amazing Holy mystery – yet it is also something we rely on every single day, so there is no way it could ever lose its gift no matter how often we come to God's table. The sacraments, Communion and Baptism, are things that draw us into God's love. They are promises made by God, wrapped up with God's word, and given physical, touchable ways that we can see them offered to us.

If you come into my office, one thing that is hard to overlook is my tapestry on the wall. It is from one of my (many) favorite passages in scripture.

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

God's requirements aren't to earn the grace given to us nor to make a payment for it either. They are simply the response that we should have when we are overwhelmed with God's love. To seek to do things justly and rightly, to love kindness and to love WITH kindness, and to just keep walking with God knowing we stumble along, and God stoops to help us up all the time.

Prayer: Amazing God, you surprise us with your gifts every day. Help us to keep our eyes and hearts open for the ways in which you bless us. You offer forgiveness when we stumble and mercy when we hurt. Help us to share those blessings that you have first given us to everyone around us. Hold us gently in the palm of your hand and support us each day. With gratitude we pray. Amen.



### TRINITY CONGREGATION COUNCIL Meeting Highlights - September 21, 2023 - 7:00 pm

### (These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Attending: Nancy Vollmer, Pat Wiedenheft, Jim Bertsch, Kathy Bango, Millie McCready, Betsy, and Carrie Wiedenheft. Absent: Carol Dahs and Pastor Jen

Meeting called to order by President – Carrie Wiedenheft Opening devotions were given by Jim Bertsch

Minutes of previous meeting (August 2023) were reviewed. Jim made a motion to accept the August meeting minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Betsy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for August 2023 was reviewed. It was noted that there have been some errors in the last couple of weeks of the offering count and the bank. It could be from the Wreaths Across America donations. Nancy made a motion to accept the August Treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kathy. Motion passed.

President's Report: October 15, 2023, at 9:00 am was set for the Congregational Annual Meeting. October's Council meeting will be moved up a week to October 12, so it is held before the Congregational meeting. A motion to accept the agenda for the Congregational Meeting was made by Millie, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Betsy. Motion passed. Jim made a motion to accept the 2024 budget with the following additions: 1. Young at Heart Group will be given a budget of \$250. Under the Congregational Life Committee. 2. The organ maintenance will go up to \$1220. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Nancy with changes. Motion passed. Nancy made a motion to add Erie County Children's Services to the Mission Endowment Fund Proceeds being pulled from the Charity Fund this year for \$500. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Millie. The new total will be \$20,500 from the Charity Fund. Motion passed. All open positions for council in 2024 are: Community Mission (Betsy), Witness & Welcome (Millie), Stewardship & Finance (Jim), Worship & Music (Nancy), Property (open). All are eligible to run again. All agreed to run again. It was requested that a notice be put in the bulletin and newsletter about the open positions. The nominating committee of Kathy, Pat, & Carrie will meet on Tuesday, September 26 at 7 pm to discuss possible new candidates.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jen will be on vacation from November 5 to November 12. This was a prepaid vacation that was approved as part of her hire. Her office hours will be Tues. through Fri. 9 am to 2 pm. Her day off will be Mondays. She will be doing a very private wedding for Kayla Strauce on October 6. First Communion will take place on October 29 during service. Millie offered to go with Pastor Jen on home visits. There will be a meeting with parents regarding confirmation classes on October 8 between services. Upcoming confirmation for Mariska Farlow.

Congregational Life – Kathy Bango – No report. Council thanked her for all receptions for Pastor Cathy & Ralph and Installation of Pastor Jen.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – First Communion will be October 29. Classes will be on October 22 for parents and students and on October 28. Trunk for Treats will be October 29 prior to Sunday School. Nancy Vollmer is working on a letter to be sent to all communion assistants regarding how communion trays should be set up. Only two grape juice cups per tray. It is parents' decision if kids take the wine or grape juice. A note will be added to the bulletin about the grape juice option. Millie McCready said she is still willing to be a communion assistant.

Mission Service – Betsy Stierhoff – Wreaths Across America is still going on. Sally will get with Brenda Ried and get things all matched up this week. Respite Home (Old Lutheran Home) is supposed to open in November. We will wait to see what they need and what we may help with.

Property – The parking lot was sealed and restriped on August 24 & 25. Renters are in the process of moving out of the parsonage. There will be an open house on October 8 to view and see what repairs are needed. Everyone is invited to tour. Still waiting on recommendations for the upstairs fellowship room updates. Repairs downstairs are on hold until the insurance company can get here and evaluate. Pat made a motion to accept the quote from Gundlach on repairing the ac unit in the downstairs fellowship hall for \$3,099.10. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kathy. Motion passed.

Stewardship & Finance – Jim Bertsch – Jim made a motion to renew one Mission Investment CD for 1 year at 4.86% and a second for 3 years at 4.76%. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Millie. Motion passed.

Witness and Welcome – Millie McCready – No report. She will assist Pastor Jen with home and nursing home visits.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer – The positions of Lectors, ushers, and communion assistants will be discussed at the next Worship and Music meeting on October 4 at 7:00 pm.

Young at Heart – Nancy Vollmer – Their first official meeting was attended by 18 people. They played bible bingo and had refreshments. Their next meeting will be October 11 at 1:00 pm. The program will be on Hobos so it is dress like a Hobo Day, refreshments will also be served.

Old Business – Council tabled the quote from Dave Thornbury on the video equipment until the October council meeting. Need more information from Carol on the quote. Pastor Jen recommended that if we did this that we chose option B which makes the camera more flexible to use. Dunlap's Snow Removal contract was signed and returned for the 2023-2024 season

New Business – There was discussion on the contract with Muller Pipe Organ on the yearly maintenance agreement as the fee has gone up for next year. Millie made a motion to accept the bid. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Betsy. Motion passed.
