Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

In the book, "Sleeping with Bread," the authors, Dennis Linn, Sheila Fabricant Linn, and Matthew Linn tell the story of comforting separated and orphaned children during World War II by giving them a loaf of bread with which to sleep. The

children found it impossible to fall asleep because of their fears for the next day. Once the caretakers allowed them to go to sleep with a small loaf of bread, the biggest fear of being hungry the next day was soothed and they managed to fall asleep much more readily. The children could see that their needs for the day had been met, and that even if they woke to find the world changed once again, they at least knew that they would be able to eat something that day. In a world filled with uncertainty and change, we must be able to hold onto something that gives us the assurance we need to face the day.

The authors go on to talk about one of my favorite prayer practices called the Examen. The Examen, which is a form of prayer developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola, is a reflective practice designed to help individuals become more aware of God's presence in their daily lives. It is a super simple practice that can be used by anyone, even the youngest of children.

First, you reflect on your day and allow yourself to become more aware of God's presence in your life. Second it is to ask where were the moments of consolation and desolation. Those are the terms that Loyola uses. Personally, I find other words to be more helpful. Highs and Lows; Grace filled moments and disgrace moments; Positive and Negative, Easy and Hard moments; closest to God and furthest from God. The goal is to simply notice both of those types of moments in your day and to allow gratitude for both. The final step is simply to express gratitude to God about your moments of consolation and desolation; to say thank you. As you do this on a regular basis it cultivates a sense of what draws you closer to God and what pushes you away, as well as deepening your sense of gratitude that in all circumstances God is with you. This practice doesn't focus on false positivity but rather acknowledges the realness and complexity that life throws at us.

In this month where we spend time talking about "Thanksgiving" may we find ways to practice giving thanks on a regular basis. As we come to church to experience the presence of God in scripture and in sacrament may it help us to be aware of the ways our lives ripple God's love through the world. And may it be the "bread" we hold onto that gives us peace.


