

Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Nancy Vollmer.

Minutes of previous meeting (October 2023) were reviewed. ## Inclement Weather Conditions Reminder

Below is Trinity's By-Laws on how services will be delt with if there is inclement weather this winter.

### PLEASE ALSO NOTE:

The front sanctuary doors <u>will not</u> be unlocked and the sidewalks to them <u>will not</u> be cleared.

Please use the south entrance or the portico door

**CR2009.01.** A policy regarding cancellation and postponement of worship and other events is hereby established.

- a. Worship and Sunday School It is the intention of the pastor and people of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Congregation to hold worship as regularly scheduled. When weather is inclement, and when roads conditions are less then optimum, worship will be held, but worshipers should not feel compelled to venture out if they believe they may not be able to do so safely. However, in the event that:
  - 1. weather and/or road conditions are such that the pastor cannot get to the church,
  - 2. the pastor and parishioners would clearly endanger themselves by trying to do so,
  - 3. there is some other situation, such as
    - (a). a declared national, state, or local emergency,
    - (b). a serious problem with the church building, such as loss of heat or water

the president of the congregation (or vice president, should the president be unavailable) and the pastor shall confer with one another, and, upon their agreement, worship may be canceled. If Sunday worship is cancelled, Sunday School shall be deemed cancelled as well. Efforts will be made to make the cancellation known to as many parishioners as possible by phone or e-mail. Parishioners should be informed that, if they question whether worship is being held, they should call the church office. A special message will be placed on the church telephone's answering device if indeed worship has been cancelled.

## **Trinity Daughter Retires from Trinity**

After thirty-nine years of church music ministry, May Schwarz has retired from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus. May was born on October 4, 1945, to the late Arlo and Myrtle (Heinzerling) Brown, and she grew up at 503 Bardshar Road, just across the street from Trinity Church. She is the sister of the late Russ Brown. May has two adult children, Krista and Hans.

From information provided by Trinity Seminary, now a part of Capital University: "Professor Schwarz came to Trinity in 1984. One of the most notable accomplishments of her 39-year tenure at Trinity was the development and leadership of the Master of Arts in Church Music program. Many in the local community have been enriched by her extracurricular activities, such as the Tuesdays at Trinity summer music series each June and the powerful Choral Evensong services held each year at All Saints and in Eastertide. Generations of Trinity students attribute their knowledge of the church's various liturgies, as well as their confidence in singing and in chanting, to Professor Schwarz's encouragement and guidance."

May's educational experience included graduation from Margaretta High School, bachelor of music from Oberlin College, master of music from The Ohio State University, and master of theological studies from Trinity Lutheran Seminary. She is rostered as a deacon in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. For decades, May was the music director of St. John's Evangelical Protestant Church (United Church of Christ) in downtown Columbus.

Trinity Congregation was happy to have May come home and serve as a Sunday organist during its Seventy-fifth Anniversary celebrations in 2001. May also played for the funeral for her mother, Myrtle, in April of 2004. May was pleased to call Trinity her home congregation.

We thank our "Columbus connection," Mary Ann Wiedenheft, for letting us know of May's retirement.
