

Dear Trinity family and friends,

Even in Lent, each Sunday is a tiny little Easter! Why? Because we always are coming to hear the good news of Christ saying that all things that separate us from God's love are gone. However, the seasons of the church year have different "flavors."

Advent is that anticipatory hopefulness that brings light to our eyes. Christmas brings the truth that God's love comes to us over and over and over again and is a gift beyond compare. Epiphany and its following Sundays are about looking to find God at work in the world. Lent brings a bit of spring cleaning. We take a little extra time to pay attention to our faith; to sweep away the things we don't need or mistakes we've made and to prepare for the central story of our faith we hear on Easter. Holy Week slows things down even more when we worship on Maundy Thursday to remember Jesus' commandment to love one another and to gather around the table. And then we join together around the cross to feel the depth of sorrow, loss, and pain that is Good Friday. Then comes the joy filled day of the resurrection! It's not just ONE DAY – it's a "week of Sundays" – 7 Sundays to celebrate God's amazing glory. With staple food (bread) and festive drink (wine) we come to the party of the year shouting "Alleluia! Christ is Risen" and respond, "He is Risen Indeed!"

After Easter will come Pentecost and the weeks after which are often called ordinary time. A time to just resume the weekly task of holding onto our faith – yet each Sunday is a reminder of God's goodness, a time to hear God's word and receive the food of mercy that sustains us each week.

I look forward to our journey through the church year together and pray that you find

what you need to sustain your faith in scripture, sacrament, and worship.



Youth and Family



Meeting Highlights - February 15, 2024 - 7:00 pm
(These are unapproved meeting minutes)

Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft Opening devotions were given by Pat Wiedenheft

Minutes of previous meeting (January 2024) were reviewed. Pat motion to accept the January meeting minutes. 2nd by Nancy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for January 2024 was reviewed. Jim stated that he mistakenly paid the parsonage expenditures out of Memorial funds instead of Thrivent Reserve. There is a CD coming up for renewal in May. Jim made a motion to take the funds from the CD when it comes due and pay the Memorial fund back instead of taking money from the Thrivent Reserve fund. 2nd by Barb. Motion passed. Nancy made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed. Jim put together a list of 2023 donations that Trinity made throughout the year. This will be added to the March Newsletter.

President's Report: Carrie reviewed items for the Congregational council meeting on March 17. She asked that the committees let the office and P. Jen know when they have meetings. Everyone needs to keep the communication flowing better between everyone.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jen, Cathy Wobser, and Patty Swartz did some home visits to Pat N., Nancy S., Bob & Alice B., Mary Ann N., and Rosemarie C. P. Jen called Compass Point and The Commons of Providence and invited them to our Lenten services and to let them know she is available if they need pastoral care. Ash Wednesday services went very well. P. Jen hosted the Eastern Conference Pastor's meeting here in January. The topic for the Lenten services is called "Baptized We Live". P. Jen is looking at May 19th for Confirmation. Pat W. volunteered to contact Zion and see if they were having their morning/afternoon Good Friday services as in the past.

Congregational Life – Kathy Bango – Kathy reported that Trinity may not have to do the March 5 Lenten meal at Zion. Kathy is ready either way.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – Sub Sandwich sale sold over 90 plus subs earning over \$500 for Grace's Table. A crew of volunteers will be in on Monday to work on cleaning up the basement.

Property – Bill Bertsch – The following updates were done: More church keys were made, work was done to stabilize the first pew rail, two new toilet seats were installed. Work at the parsonage is complete now. Bill will look into the following yet: Loose tiles in the choir room, one new toilet seat needed yet, quotes needed for garage door opener for parsonage, put hooks in sacristy closet, hand rail going to basement needs to be looked at, quote needed for stripping and rewaxing of floor downstairs, more quotes for air conditioning for the parsonage, rotted basement window at parsonage, leak in front porch of parsonage. Sorgen's Refrigeration was in and serviced the freezer and refrigerator downstairs. P. Jen has provided pictures of the updates to the parsonage for Trinity's insurance files. Mike Sabo has the shiplap finished in the fellowship hall. He is looking into the baseboard yet and a couple of doors need to be worked on. Bill made a motion to approve the quote from Gundlach to replace the valve that was leaking last year and temporarily repaired. 2nd by Jim. Motion passed. Stewardship & Finance – Jim Bertsch – The 2023 financial audit has been completed and everything looks good. Just a note: our new video equipment is covered under our personal property insurance and not separately. There is approximately \$18,400 left from the insurance payment to finish the repairs to the basement.

Witness & Welcome – Gayle Thompson – Carrie and Gayle will get together and go over what her position involves.

Worship and Music – Nancy Vollmer/Barb Sessler – Ash Wednesday early service was attended by 32 and 25 stayed for lunch following. Three options for communion will be given at the congregational council meeting for voting upon. It needs to be decided by the congregation what their preference is for when communion is done.

Young at Heart – 200 pairs of eclipse glasses were sold with proceeds going to the Community Mission fund. 487 Valintine's cookies were baked and decorated. They were distributed to the State Highway Police, Compass Point, Shut-ins, Providence Memory unit, Sheriff's office in Castalia, and N/A here at Trinity. March 13 at 1:00 pm is their next gathering with Lieutenant Tom Salmon talking on Senior Safety.

Old Business - Waiting on a maintenance contract from Gundlach on our a/c and heating units, including the parsonage.

New Business – Easter flowers from Corso's will be done again this year. Lenten "Self-denial/Community Outreach" letter for 2024 was mailed on February 12. Pat made a motion to reinstate Amy (Wobser) Brocco as an active member of Trinity. 2nd by Barb. Motion passed. Bill made a motion that we go with Great Lakes for our future Generac repairs and maintenance contract. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed.



April 8, 2024 will be Total Solar Eclipse in the Sandusky area.

Below is a timeline for the eclipse. Be sure to check the local news for more information on how to prepare for the event.

* Timings for the beginning & end of partial eclipse, the beginning & end of totality, and maximum eclipse are accurate to within a few seconds. This calculation uses a Delta T value of 69.22 seconds.

Timings for other events are approximate—they are included here as a rough guide to features that might be observable. The icons show the position of the Moon against the Sun at each stage, but they do not show the correct position of the diamond ring and Baily's beads.
