Meeting called to order by President - Carrie Wiedenheft

Opening devotions were given by Kathy Bango

Minutes of previous meeting (July 2024) were reviewed. Pat made a motion to accept the July meeting minutes. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report for July 2024 were reviewed. Jim said the Community Mission funds for the 2nd half of the year were mailed out. Thank you notes are coming in now. Barb made a motion to accept the July treasurer's report. 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed.

President's Report: Carrie reported that Carol's husband is looking to retire somewhere in the next year and a half. This will make it so that Carol needs to find health insurance and/or a raise in pay. Discussion followed. The team of P. Jen, Bill, and Jim will look into options for Trinity and Carol. Carrie and P. Jen have been discussing starting up a High School Sunday School Class. Hoping to have something going by October. They are also looking into having some youth participate in the ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis MN in 2027.

Pastor's Report: P. Jen did some checking with Portico on health insurance for Carol. She was able to find that Portico will insure part time people and received some quotes. The wedding of Kim Stierhoff and Morgan Otto will take place this Saturday. Omni Fiber was installed at the parsonage and church. Need to switch the phones over yet. Shut in visits have been delayed. Stephen Sharp and his daughter are back in the area and have attended Trinity services. P. Jen had lunch with a fellow Episcopal priest. P. Jen and Malachi will be on vacation August 20 through 23. P. Jen will be on vacation November 10 and will find a fill in for that Sunday.

Congregational Life – Kathy Bango – The Cancer Center wanted to thank The Young at Heart for the 36 bags for cancer patients plus extra supplies.

Faith Builders – Pat Wiedenheft – There will be the annual blessing of the book bags on August 25. Sunday School will probably start on September 15.

Community Mission – Betsy Stierhoff – Betsy's group assembled 100 lunch bags for Care & Share on July 28. They are currently collecting LWR personal care kit items that will be assembled on September 8 for GWOH's day. Jim received \$250 from Thrivent to help purchase needed items.

Property – Bill Bertsch – Bill will call Diamond Dave about the garage door opener for the parsonage. Basement window at the parsonage does need to be replaced. Bill will see if he can contact someone to work on this. Bill sprayed for wasps in the garage and corrected the drainage on the ac unit in the basement. The new freezer is in the basement and the old has been hauled away. Bill installed some hooks in the sacristy for the candle starters. The storm windows should be installed the week after Labor Day.

Stewardship & Finance – Jim Bertsch – A CD came do and Jim renewed it for another year. The interest rate has dropped from 5.15% to 4.15%.

Worship and Music - Nancy Vollmer/Barb Sessler - Their next meeting will be in September.

Young at Heart – Nancy Vollmer – Cancer bags were assembled and then cupcakes from Candy were enjoyed. Next month they will be having lunch at Vita and then visiting Care and Share for a tour. They are looking into seeing a couple Harlequin plays in 2025.

Old Business – Barb S & Bonnie L. are working on getting picture frames to hang P. Kathy, P. Ralph, and P. Jen's pictures in the office.

New Business – It was discussed on how to shorten up the bulletin to help conserve paper. Printing of the Prayers of Intersession and The Lord's Prayer could be done. Less copies can be done if first service continues to leave most of them ______ for the second service.
